



North Carolina Counties: 2022 Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is one measure of economic health. It measures the size of a county's economy, just as national GDP measures the economic size of the US economy. County GDP is a relatively new economic indicator, first released by the US Bureau of Economic Analysis in 2019.

61 Counties

experienced economic growth in 2022, as measured by GDP.

41 Counties

grew faster than the average US growth rate of 1.9% in 2022.

2 Counties

saw impressive double-digit growth in 2022: Richmond (11%) and Anson (10%).
