### Vision Statement

Our Association supports and promotes the well-being of all North Carolina counties through advocacy, education, research, and member services.

### Core Values

- The Association recognizes counties' critical partnership with the state of North Carolina and promotes strategies that enhance state and county collaboration, communication, and cooperation.
- Counties are an integral part of a strong intergovernmental system, along with municipalities, school boards, and the state and federal government. Cooperation and communication between all levels of government are essential in order to provide the best and most efficient services to citizens. Counties are the level of government closest to the people.
- The Association promotes strengthening of local decision-making to respond to local needs. Counties should be free to organize as appropriate for efficient and effective delivery of services. Flexibility of form, function, and finance is critical. A proper balance of service responsibility and revenue generating authority is imperative.
- Essential services should be financed through state or federal revenues to ensure statewide availability and consistency. State-mandated services should be funded from state revenue sources; federally mandated services should be financed from federal revenue sources.
- Policy changes affecting counties should be preceded by fair and equitable negotiations.

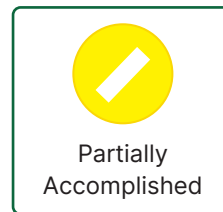
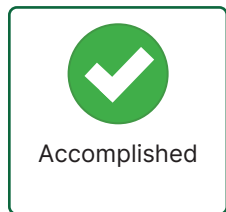
- New initiatives should allow adequate lead time for implementation within the county budget schedule. The state should consider the resource limitations of counties when implementing new state and federal programs.

## Top Legislative Priority Goals

### Approved and Ranked at the 2024 Legislative Goals Conference

After the voting body concluded adopting our state and federal legislative goals, delegates were asked to rank the state goals in order of importance to establish the top five legislative priority goals. The Credentials Committee and NCACC staff then compiled the votes to determine the results.





-  Support legislation promoting teacher and classified school personnel recruitment and retention, including state funding for increased salaries.
-  Seek legislation to repeal NCGS 105-275(45), which mandates that counties must exclude 80 percent (80%) of the appraised value of a solar energy electric system from property taxation. If repeal of NCGS 105-275(45) is not feasible, then seek legislation to require the State of North Carolina to provide funding to any county that is forced to lose tax revenue due to NCGS 105-275(45) in an amount equal to the lost tax revenue to said county.
-  Seek legislation to provide increased recurring state funding in keeping with comparable sales for farmland preservation initiatives and additional flexibility to counties related to farmland preservation.
-  Seek legislation expanding state funding to provide essential medical, mental health, substance use disorder, and social services to persons incarcerated in local detention facilities.
-  Seek governmental funding to assist counties that have limited resources with construction of critical facilities.

## Legislative Goals Status Updates



### Agriculture

-  **[Top Legislative Priority Goal]** Seek legislation to provide increased recurring state funding in keeping with comparable sales for farmland preservation initiatives and additional flexibility to counties related to farmland preservation.
-  Seek legislation amending G.S. 106-740 to provide for an adequate time to hold a public hearing, and to investigate and develop recommendations on proposed acquisitions of qualifying farmland within a voluntary agricultural district.





### Environment

-  Seek legislation to provide additional resources for preventative storm damage maintenance and disaster mitigation in all 100 counties.
-  Support legislation for clean water funds and hold companies that have manufactured emerging and other contaminants such as coal ash, PFOA, PFOS, and other PFAS chemicals financially liable for cleanup and mitigation efforts.
-  Seek additional resources and legislation to repair, govern, and maintain distressed water and sewer systems and to expand access to water and sewer for unserved residents.
-  Support state funding to research and combat invasive species.






### General Government

-  Seek legislation, funding and other efforts to expand digital infrastructure broadband capability to the unserved and underserved areas and residents of the state.
-  **[Top Legislative Priority Goal]** Seek governmental funding to assist counties that have limited resources with construction of critical facilities.

### General Government (cont.)





-  Seek legislation to authorize the electronic publication on the websites of the boards of county commissioners of public notices and advertisements that are ordinarily required to be published in the newspaper or posted on private property.
-  Support legislation to increase the number of state-funded county Veteran Services Officers to at least one per county.
-  Seek statutory flexibilities, funding, and other resources to ensure continuity of county services and a robust recovery for counties impacted by Hurricane Helene and any other natural disasters.
-  Seek legislation to provide recurring funding to state affordable housing programs, such as the Workforce Housing Loan program.

### Health and Human Services




-  Seek additional resources and state leadership for adult protective services, senior services, and foster care.
-  Seek legislation to increase resources for behavioral health and intellectual and developmental disabilities services and facilities, including dedicated resources for treatment of substance use disorders; care for individuals in county jails; inpatient crisis beds; and community paramedicine projects.
-  Seek legislation that promotes opioid and other substance use prevention, intervention, harm reduction, treatment, and recovery initiatives.
-  Seek additional state resources for early childhood education, childcare services, and pre-K programs.
-  Seek legislation to increase recurring state funding to local health departments for foundational/essential public health services.

## Health and Human Services (cont.)

-  Support legislation that restores state funding for accreditation for local health departments and to the Association of North Carolina Boards of Health for training activities required for accreditation.
-  Support legislation requiring Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBMs) to disclose pricing, rebate arrangements, and reimbursement practices to ensure fairness and accountability.
-  Seek legislation to cover all costs associated with the School Nurse Funding Initiative.
-  Seek state resources to fund dedicated physical spaces and necessary staffing to serve foster children held in county custody.






## Justice and Public Safety

-  **[Top Legislative Priority Goal]** Seek legislation expanding state funding to provide essential medical, mental health, substance use disorder, and social services to persons incarcerated in local detention facilities.
-  Seek legislation to increase the amount paid to county jails by the state to the full cost reimbursement for housing sentenced inmates.
-  Seek increased state funding to fully support drug treatment courts and other specialty courts.


## Public Education

-  Support school calendar policy that promotes optimal student outcomes and best meets the needs of local communities.
-  Support legislation that promotes education attainment and career and college readiness by increasing funding to expand apprenticeship and internship programs, (cont.)

## Public Education (cont.)







- trade certification, and workforce development programs, as well as increased student support services in public schools with a focus on dropout prevention and an increase in the dropout age.
-  Seek legislation and funding to expand registered apprenticeship tuition waivers to an applicant's 25th birthday to align with the opportunity youth demographic.
-  Seek additional revenue sources to address statewide public school and community college capital needs and ensure methods used to distribute school capital funding considers the needs of both low-wealth and growing counties.
-  Support legislation modernizing public school funding models in a changing school funding landscape to provide all public school students with an excellent education, including investments to assist communities in eliminating achievement disparities.
-  Support increased funding to provide counties an equal opportunity to implement school security measures.
-  **[Top Legislative Priority Goal]** Support legislation promoting teacher and classified school personnel recruitment and retention, including state funding for increased salaries.

## Tax and Finance


-  Seek legislation to give counties flexibility with use of occupancy taxes.

## **Tax and Finance (cont.)**

-  **[Top Legislative Priority Goal]** Seek legislation to repeal NCGS 105-275(45), which mandates that counties must exclude 80 percent (80%) of the appraised value of a solar energy electric system from property taxation. If repeal of NCGS 105-275(45) is not feasible, then seek legislation to require the State of North Carolina to provide funding to any county that is forced to lose tax revenue due to NCGS 105-275(45) in an amount equal to the lost tax revenue to said county.
-  Seek legislation that allows for equitable application of the homestead exemption for all 100 counties.
-  Seek legislation to preserve existing local revenue by providing just compensation to counties for property acquired by the state and removed from the ad valorem tax base.
-  Seek legislation allowing counties to levy the Article 43 and Article 46 sales taxes for any legal purpose and optionally to include specific language on the sales tax referendum ballot indicating how the proposed tax proceeds will be spent.
-  Seek legislation to replace the existing sales tax refund for local governments and nonprofit entities with a sales tax exemption.
-  Seek revisions to NCGS 105-187.19(b) so that the Scrap Tire Disposal Tax currently credited to the State General Fund are instead credited to the Scrap Tire Disposal Account.

## **Federal Legislative Goals Status Updates**

-  Support funding for behavioral health programs and services to address the opioid and substance use epidemic and support flexibility for counties to use funds for prevention and recovery.

-  Support measures to reduce the number of people with mental illness in county jails and legislation that would allow individuals in custody to continue receiving Medicaid and other federal health benefits until they are convicted, sentenced, and incarcerated.
-  Oppose unfunded mandates and changes in eligibility for federal programs that shift costs to counties.
-  Seek federal legislation to increase Payments in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) payments for counties.
-  Seek legislation, funding, and other efforts to expand digital infrastructure and broadband capability to the unserved and underserved areas and residents in North Carolina and provide affordable high-speed internet services to all residents including low-income customers.
-  Support increased funding for disaster preparation, assistance, and mitigation; legislation or policy changes that expedite and expand county use of federal disaster assistance funds; legislation or policy changes to streamline and expedite the FEMA individual assistance process; and legislation to review and update flood maps more frequently in counties experiencing high rates of population growth and counties prone to flooding.
-  Support efforts to promote food system resiliency, such as ways to strengthen North Carolina's food system and increase access to affordable, healthy food options.
-  Support additional flexibility and an extension in the deadline for spending American Rescue Plan (ARP) State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF).
-  Support strong regulation and enforcement along with necessary funding or reimbursement to state and local governments when a federal agency, such as the EPA regulates emerging contaminants and other discharges into drinking water sources.
