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Overview

The 2018 County Map Book includes several indicators mapped in years past, and adds a few new maps that align with county work and governance.

Economic Development

- Comparing the statewide unemployment rate exactly one year later shows a reduction from 4.8% to 4.1%, though several counties are still experiencing unemployment higher than the statewide rate.
- Voters in seven counties approved the quarter-cent local sales and use tax levy authorized under Article 46 of G.S. Chapter 105 during the May 2018 election. This marks the largest number of approved quarter-cent sales tax referenda in one election since the authorization was granted.

Education

- The high school graduation rate increased from 85.9% to 86.5% statewide, continuing the upward trend of more than ten years.
- County current expense funding per student, which is the amount reported to be contributed by the county, increased by 4% statewide over last year.

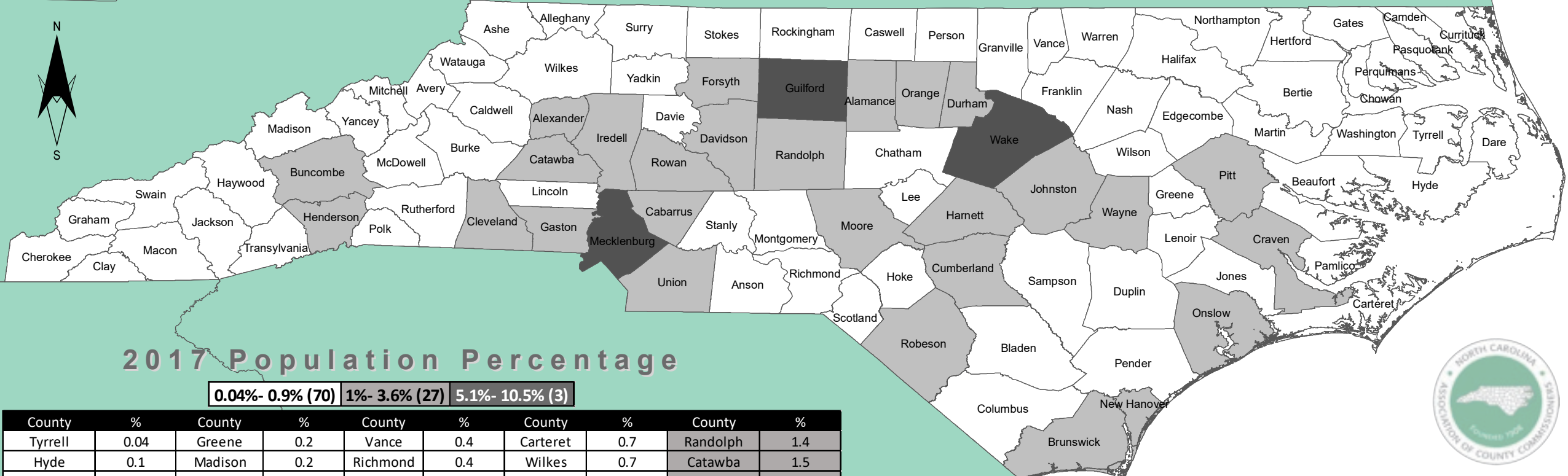
Overview

New Data Indicators

- The Medicaid Eligible Individuals by County map shows data from the Division of Medical Assistance in the N.C. Dept. of Health and Human Services. Statewide, there were more than 2.3 million people eligible for Medicaid last year.
- Reflecting active farm land in the state, the Total Farm Land map shows the total acres per county.
- The Sworn Officers map provides data from the Uniform Crime Reporting Program in the FBI Criminal Justice Information Services Division, which reflects the number of sworn officers in each county sheriff's department.
- While the Opiate Deaths map is not new to the map book this year, data from the most recent year available unfortunately show an increase in deaths in most counties, indicating the ongoing challenge this epidemic presents.

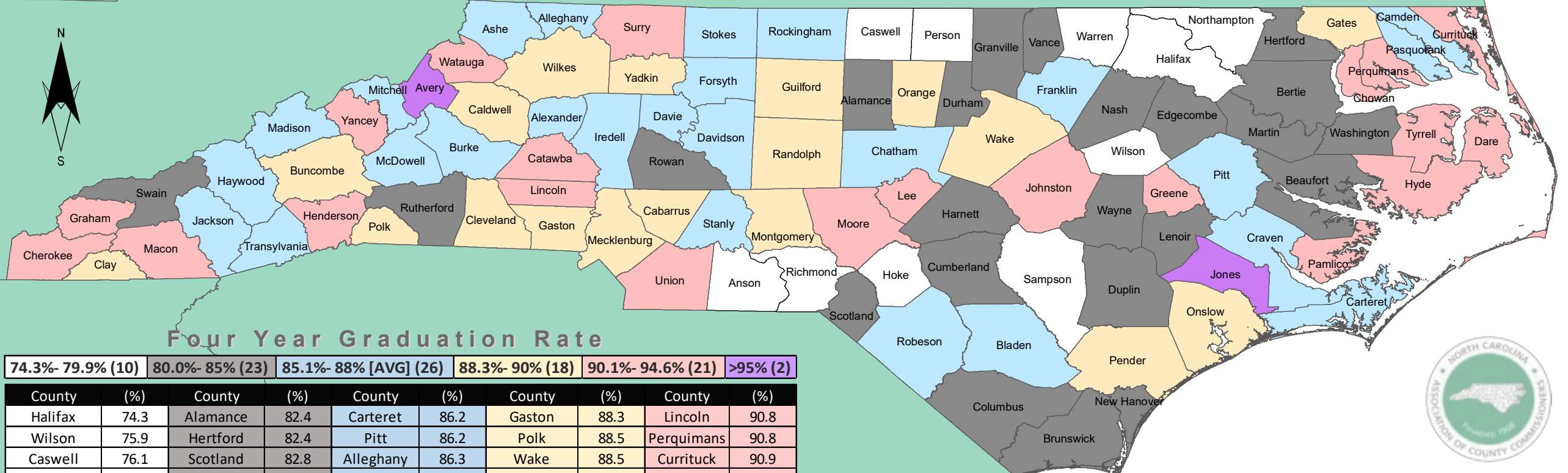

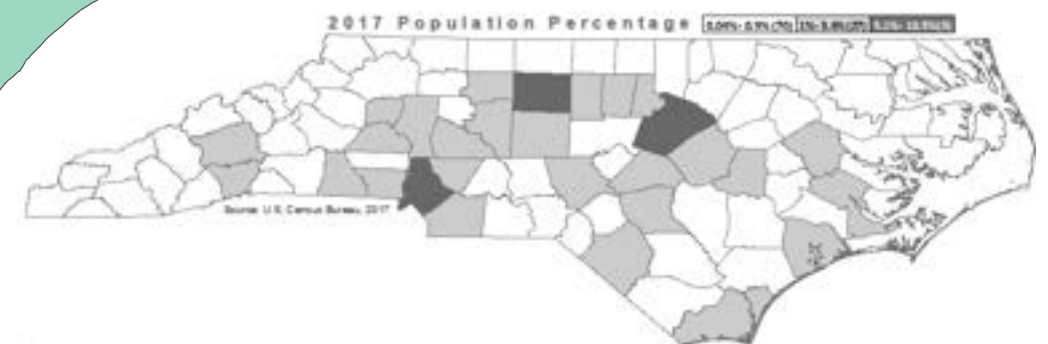
HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES (2017)



Four Year Graduation Rate

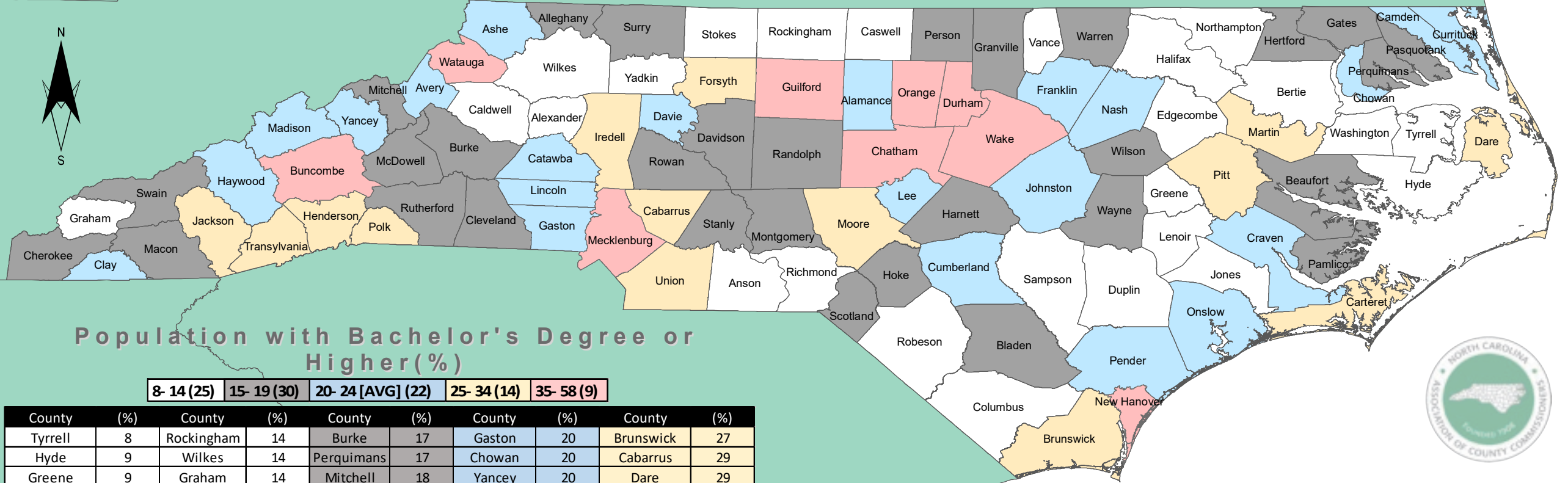

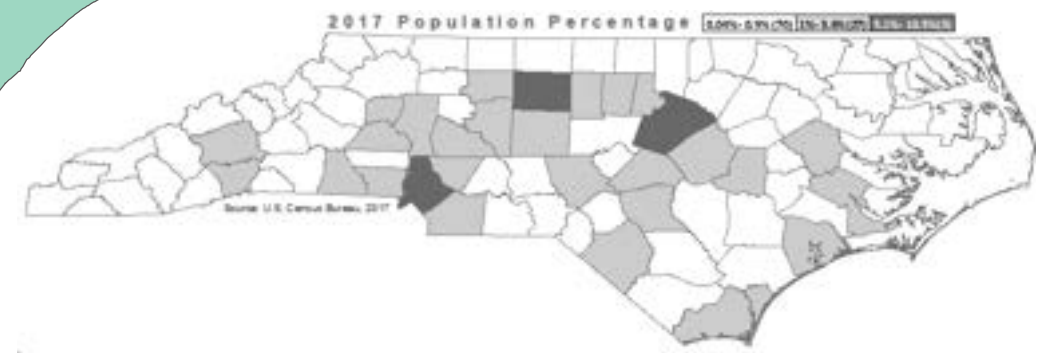
EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT PER COUNTY; BACHELOR'S DEGREE OR HIGHER

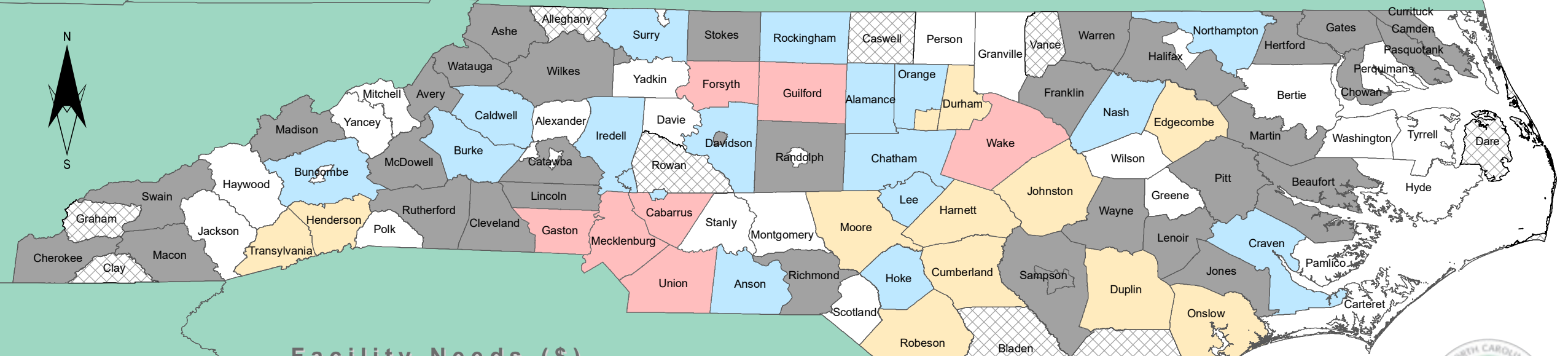

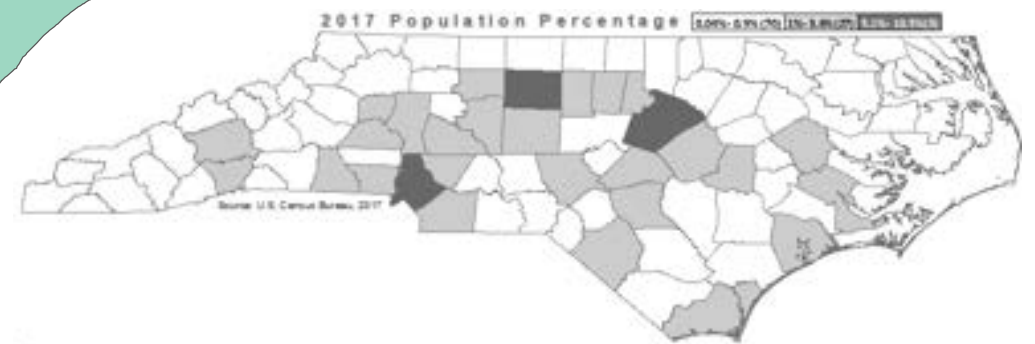
FIVE YEAR PUBLIC SCHOOL FACILITY NEEDS (2015-16)

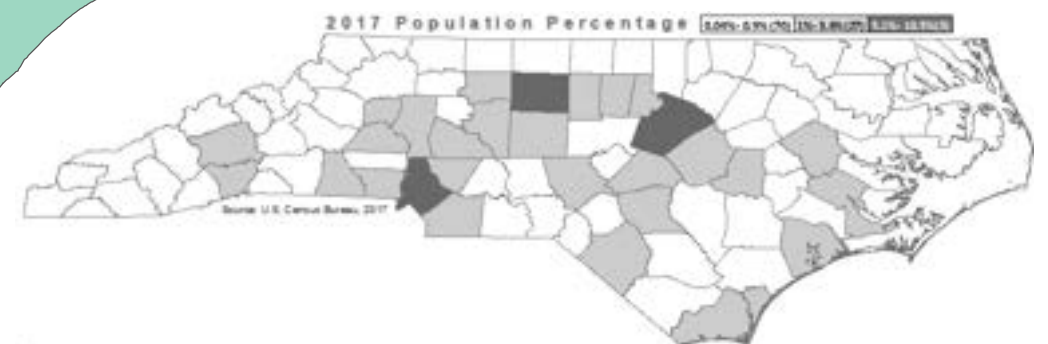
PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDING CAPITAL FUND DISTRIBUTION (2017-18)



Public School Building Fund Capital Distribution (\$)

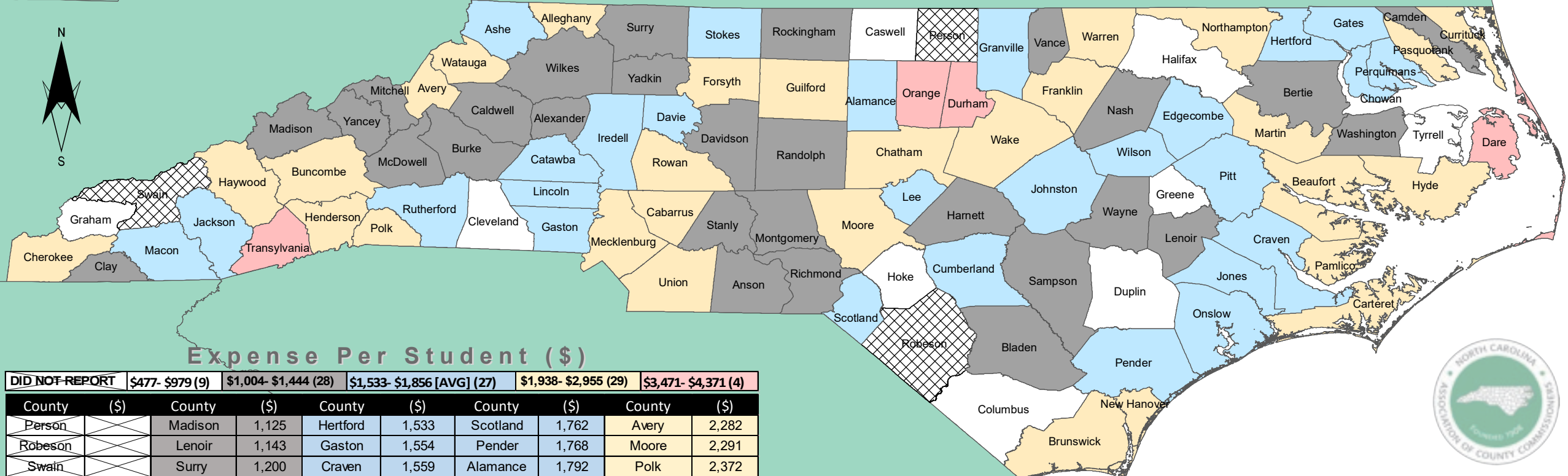

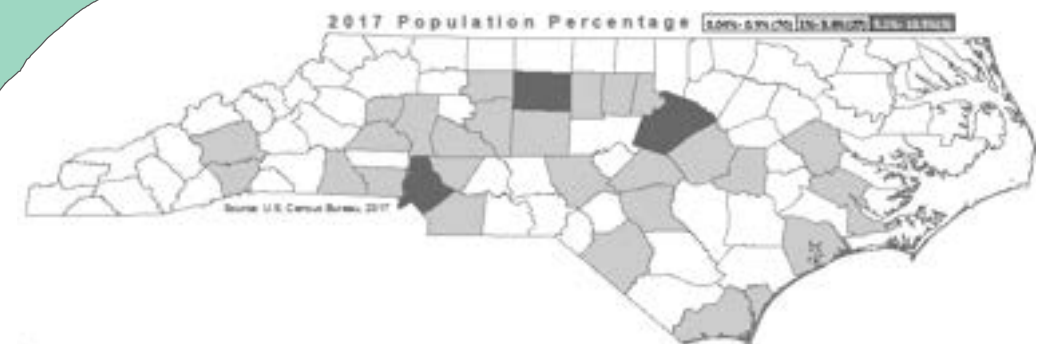

LOCAL CURRENT EXPENSE PER STUDENT (2017-18)



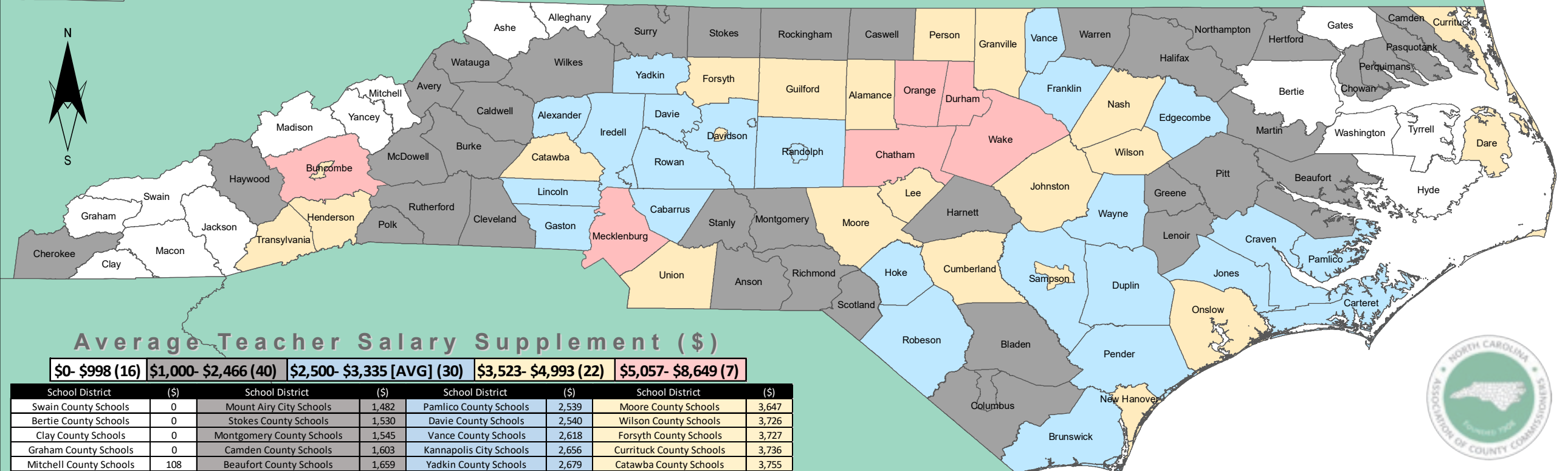

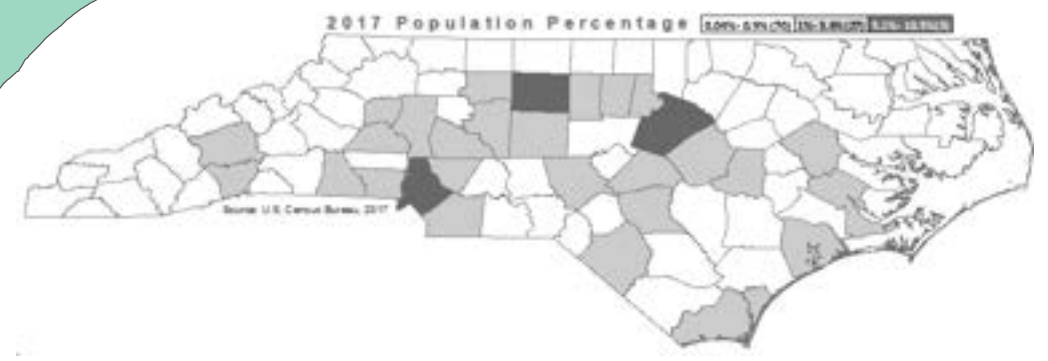
AVERAGE TEACHER SALARY SUPPLEMENT (2017-18)

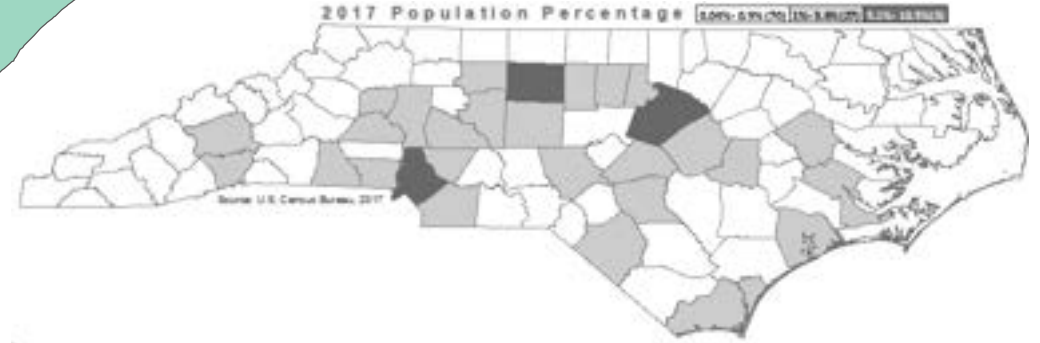
PERCENT OF K-12 STUDENTS ENROLLED IN A CHARTER SCHOOL (2017-18)

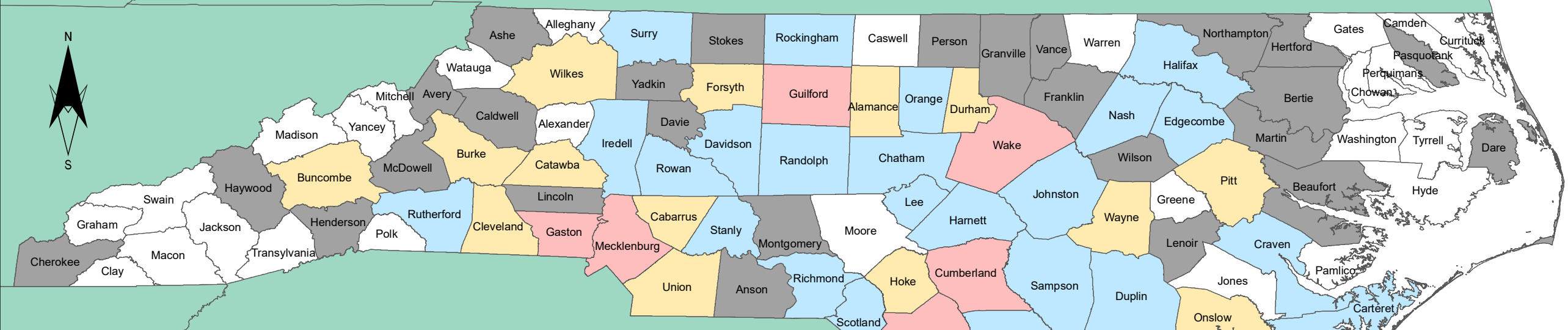

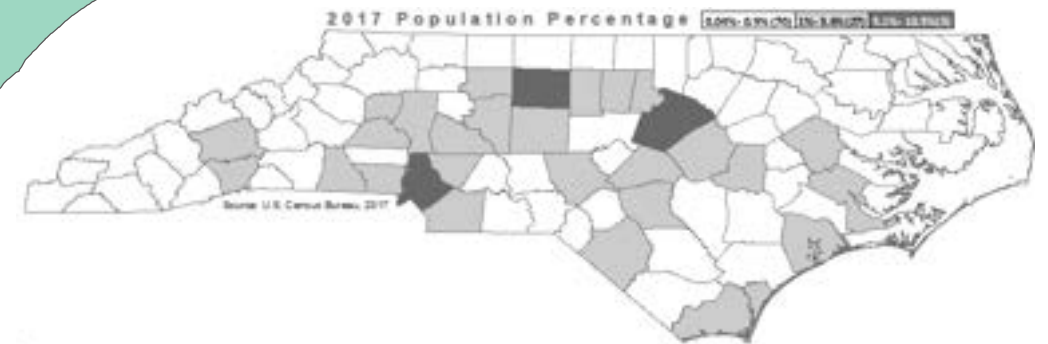
PRE-KINDERGARTEN ENROLLMENT (2017-18)

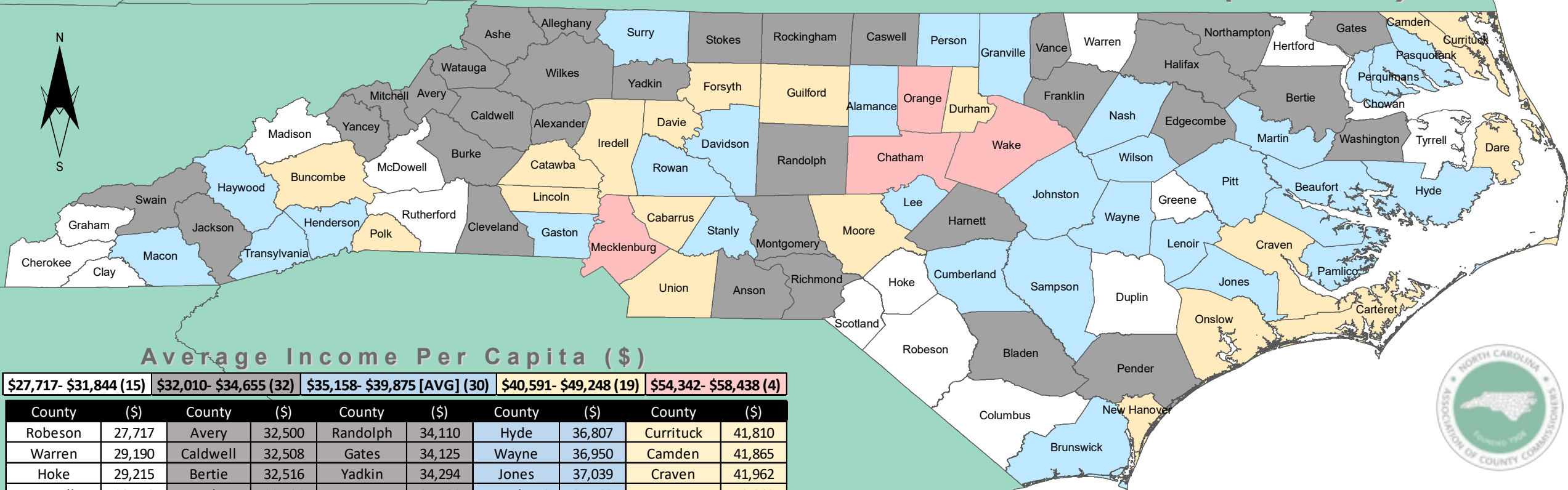

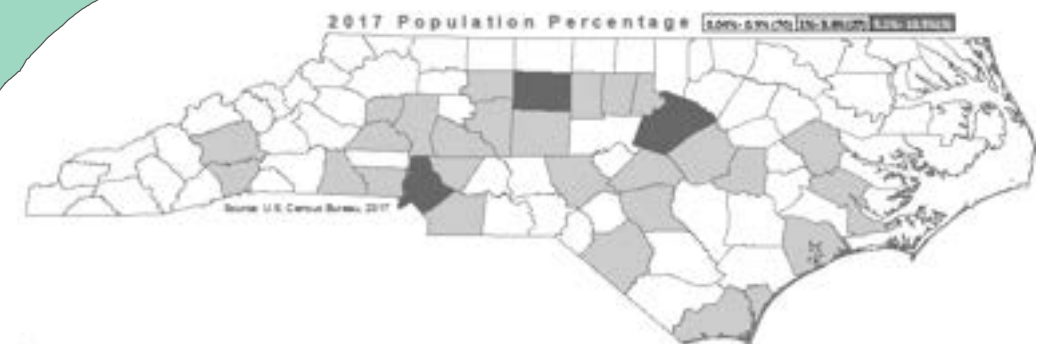
AVERAGE INCOME PER CAPITA (2016)

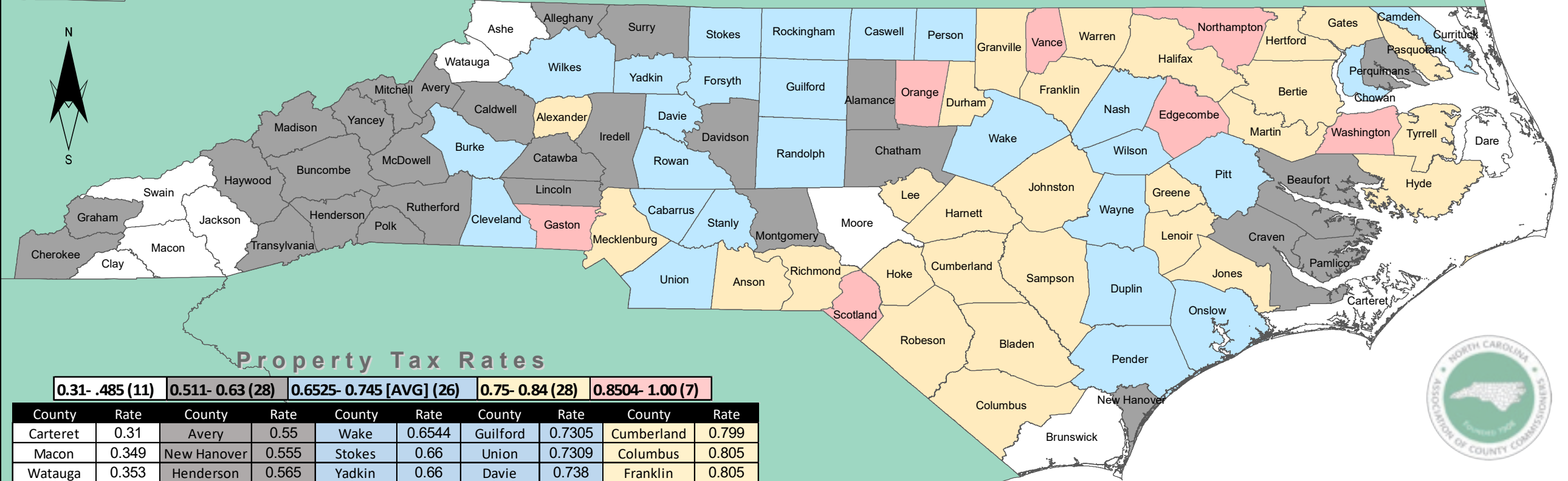

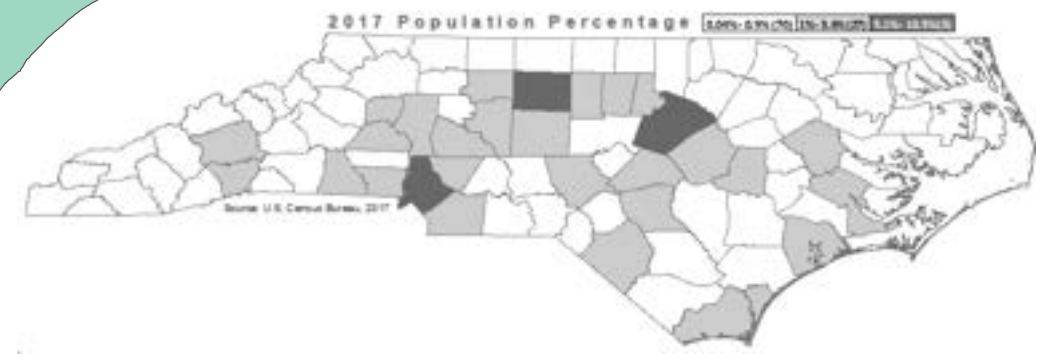
PROPERTY TAX RATES (2018-19)

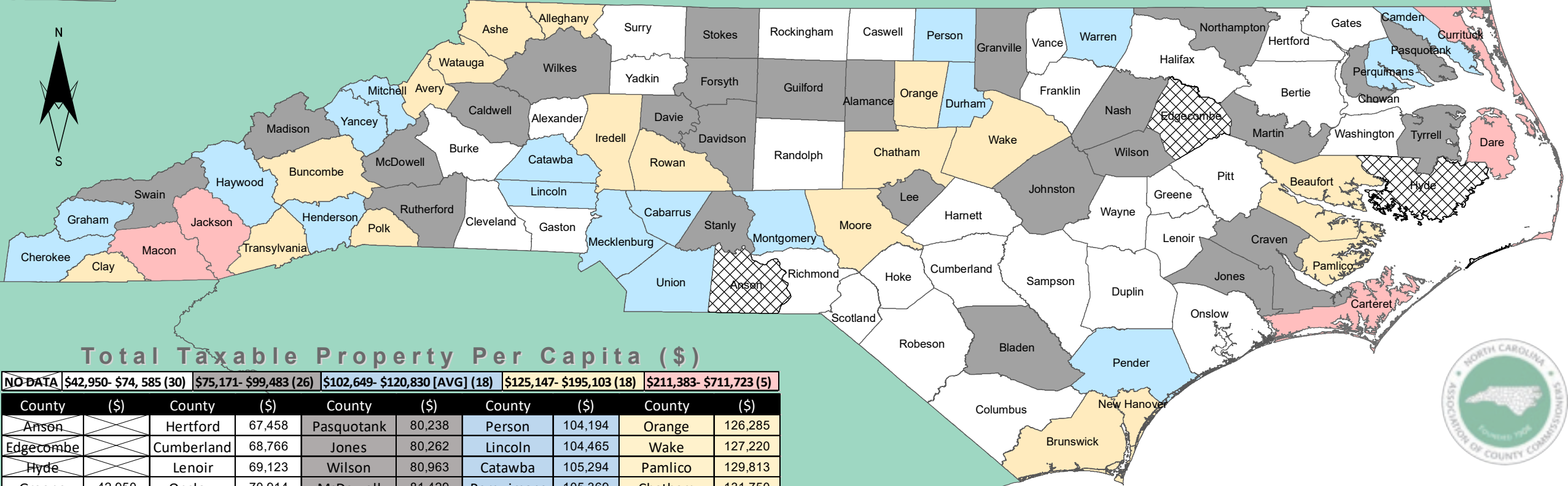

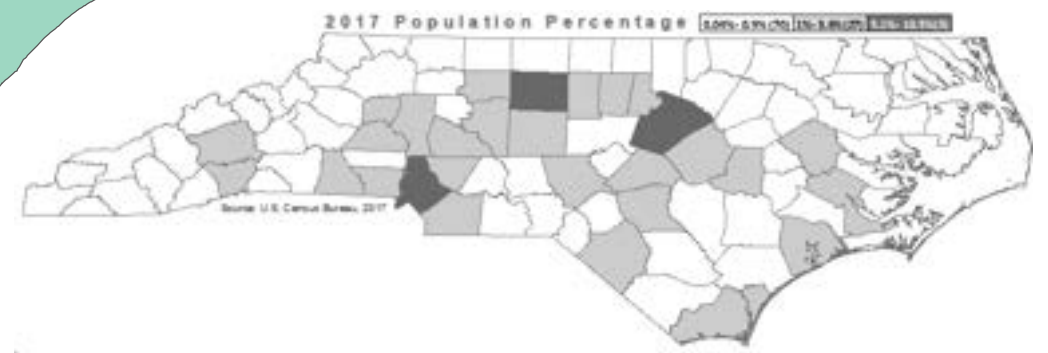
TOTAL TAXABLE PROPERTY PER CAPITA (2016-18)

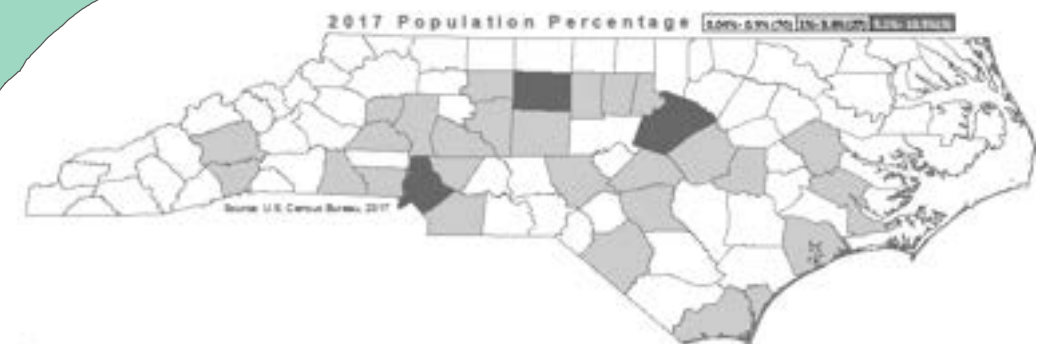
AVERAGE PROPERTY VALUE (2015)

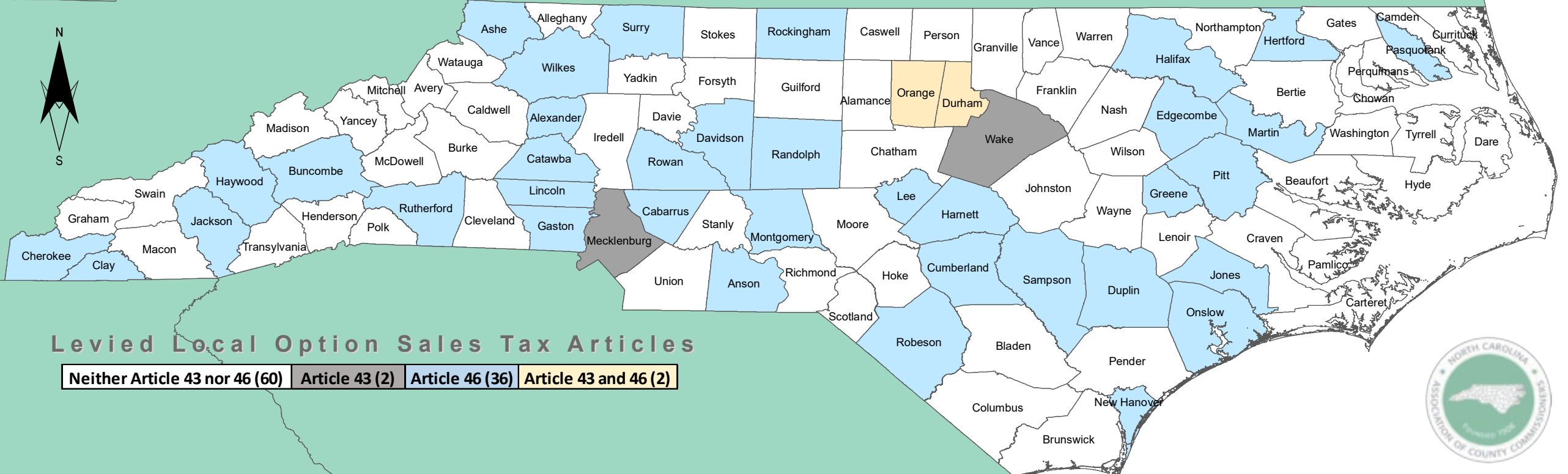

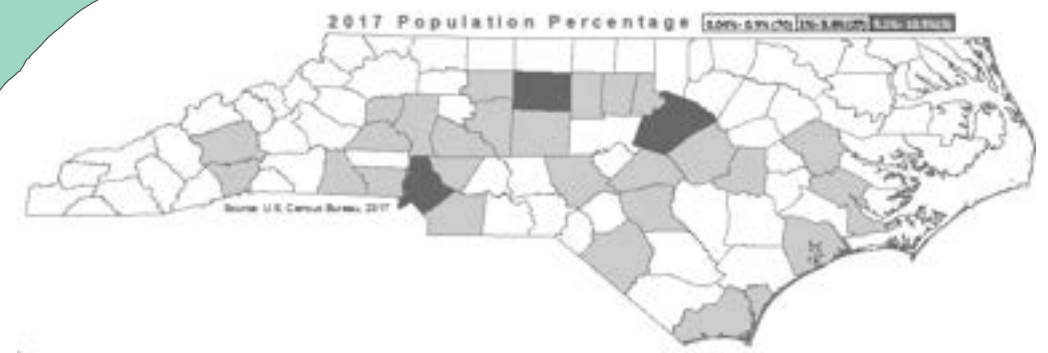

COUNTIES LEVYING SALES TAX ARTICLES 43, 46, OR BOTH



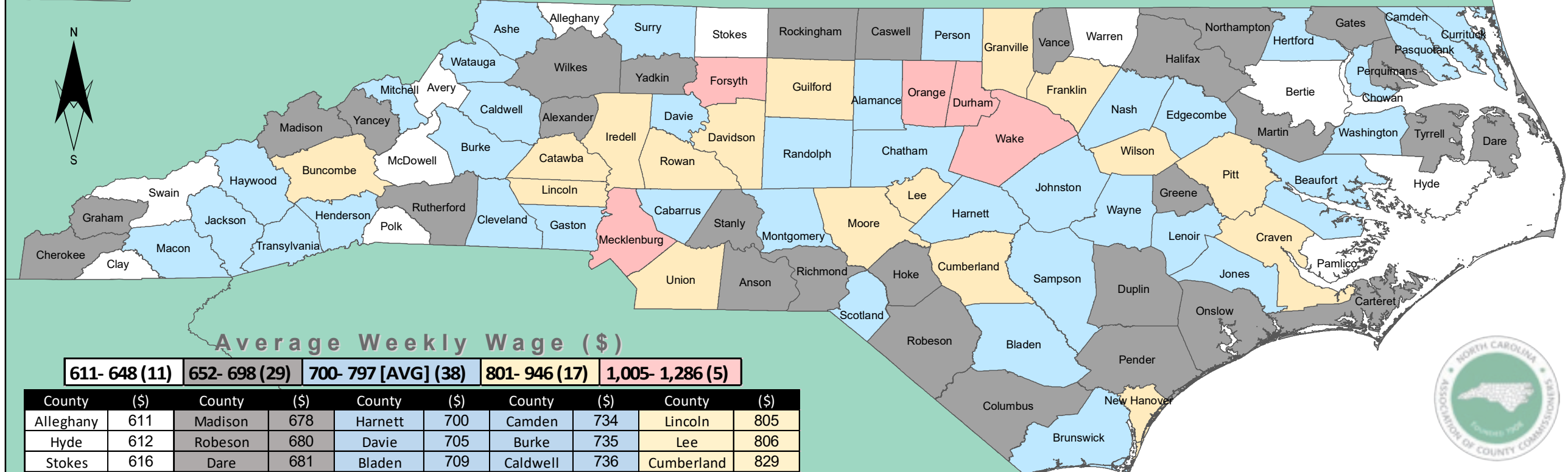

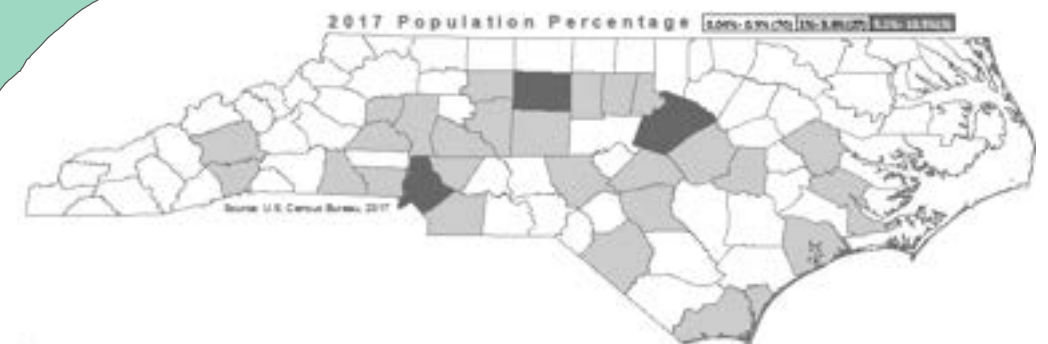
AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGE (2017)

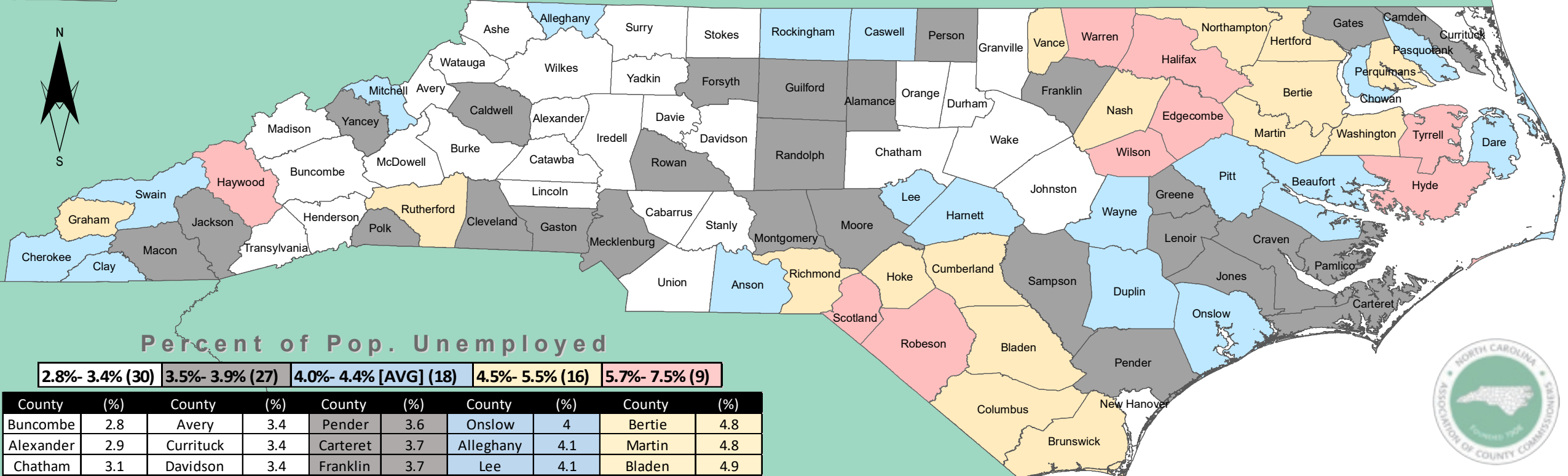

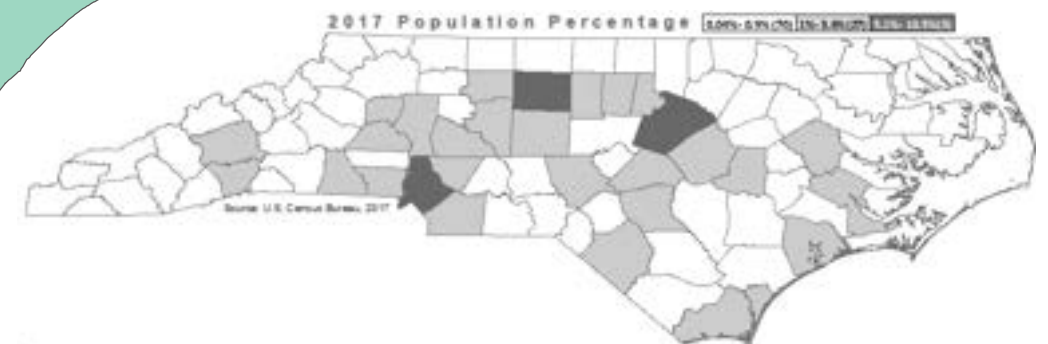
PERCENT OF UNEMPLOYED POP. PER COUNTY (MAY 2018)

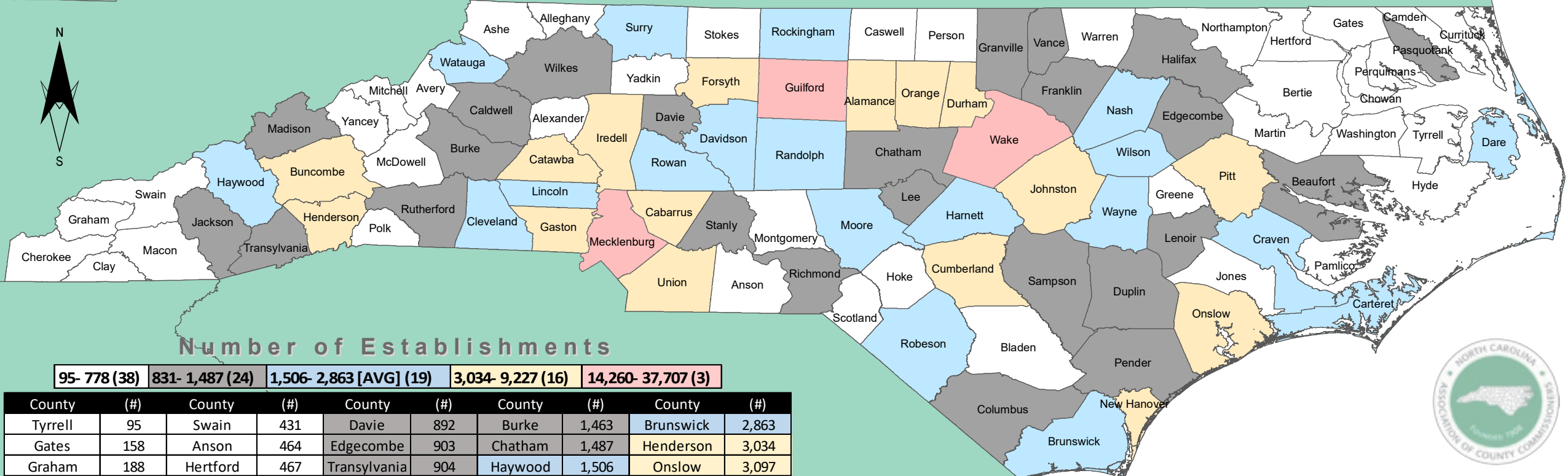

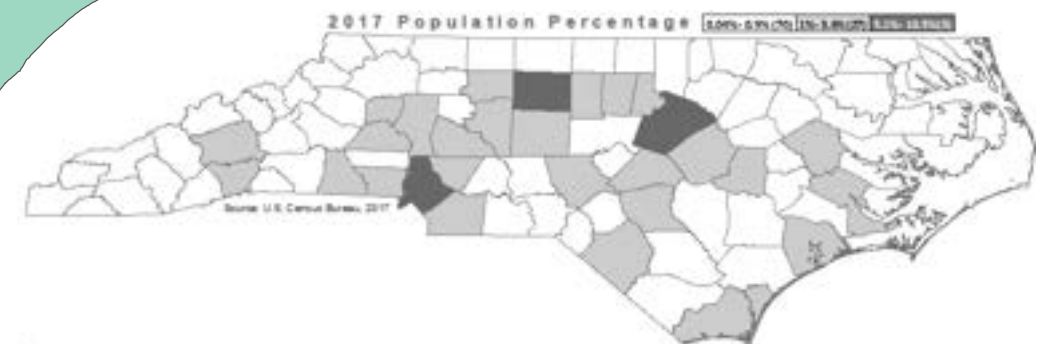
NUMBER OF ESTABLISHMENTS PER COUNTY (2017)

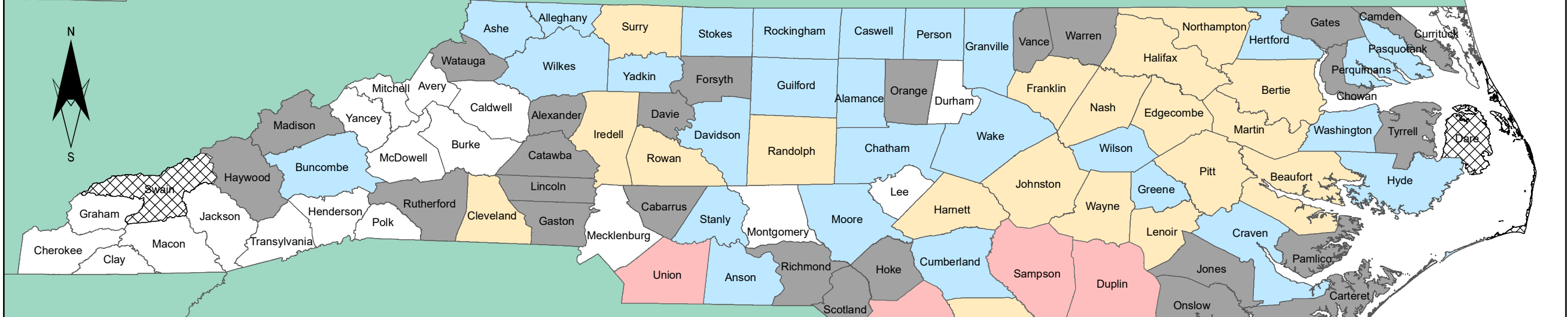

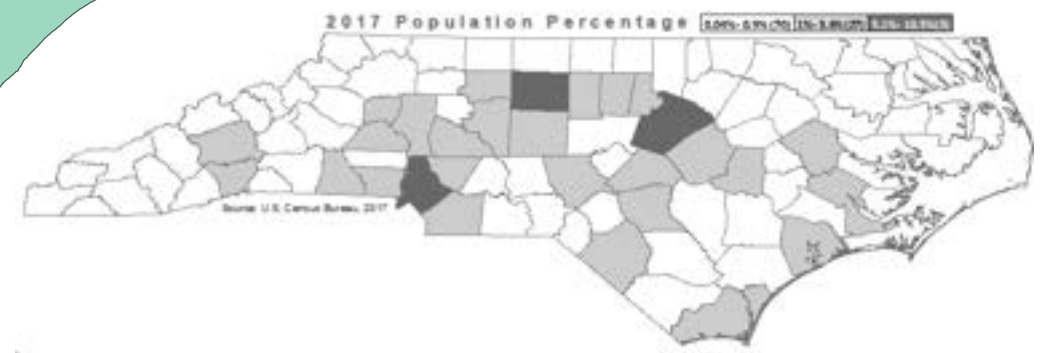

TOTAL FARM LAND (2017)



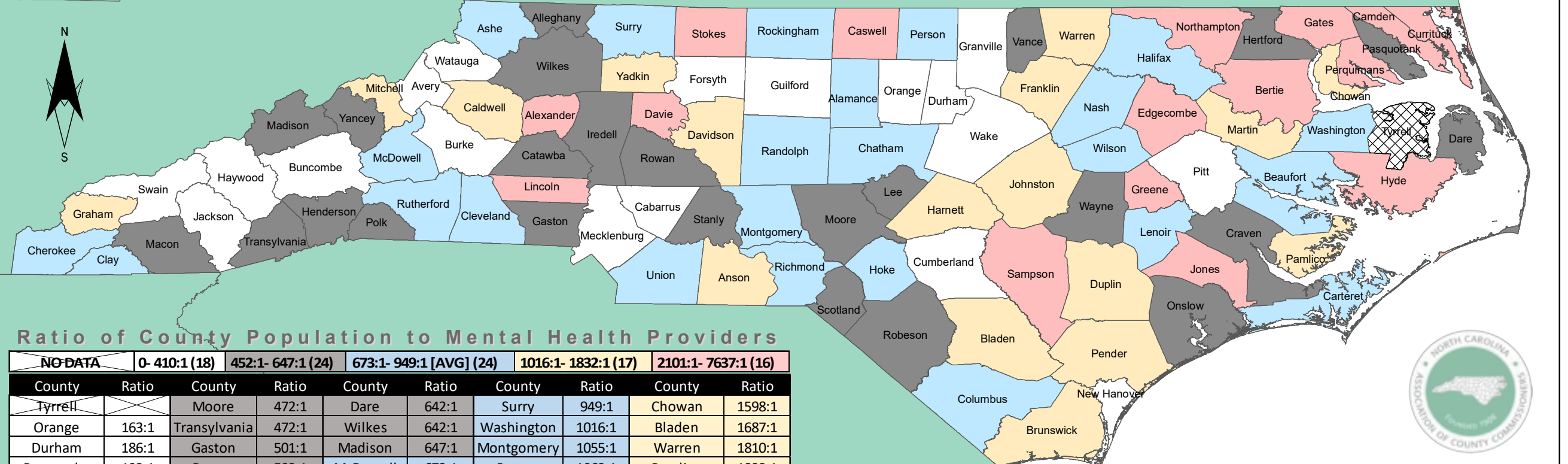

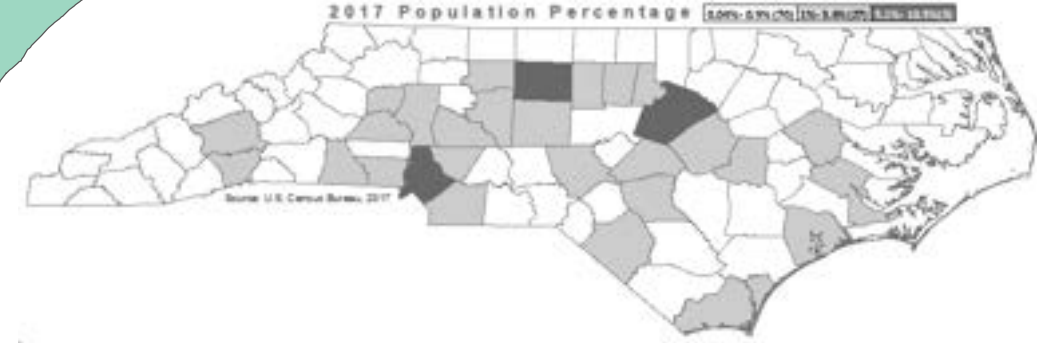

RATIO OF COUNTY POPULATION TO NUMBER OF MENTAL HEALTH PROVIDERS (2018)



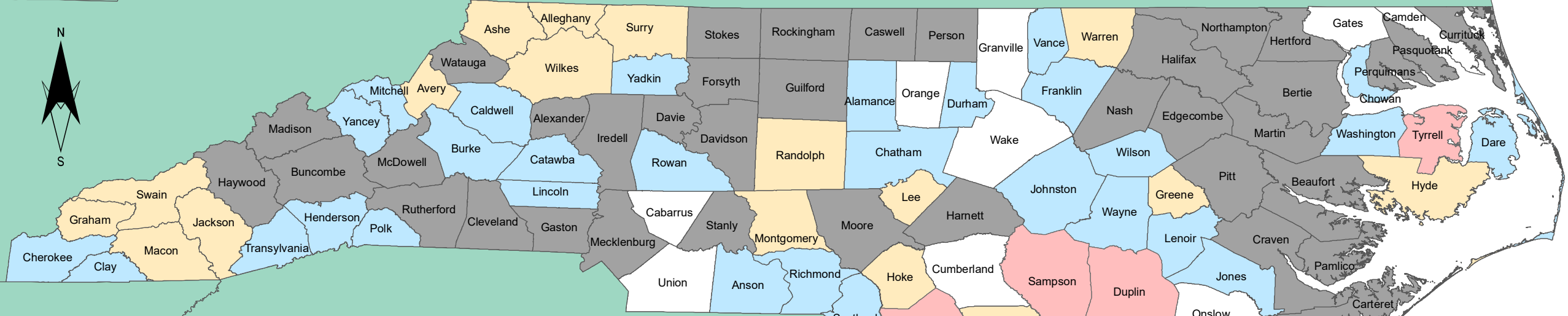

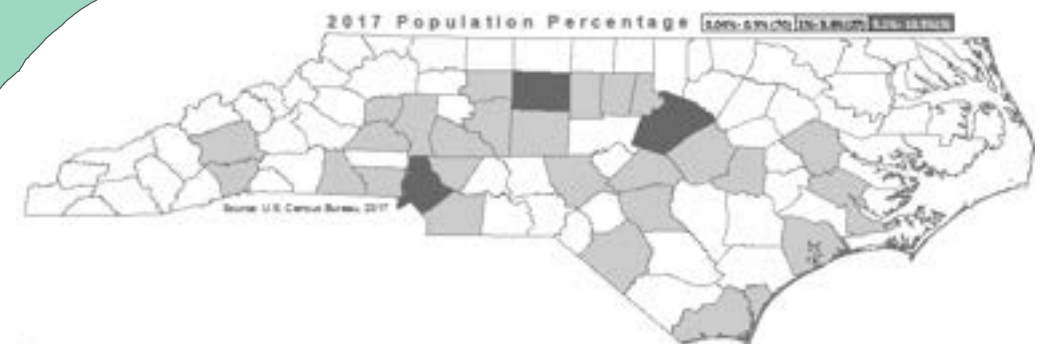
PERCENT OF COUNTY POPULATION WITHOUT HEALTH INSURANCE (2018)

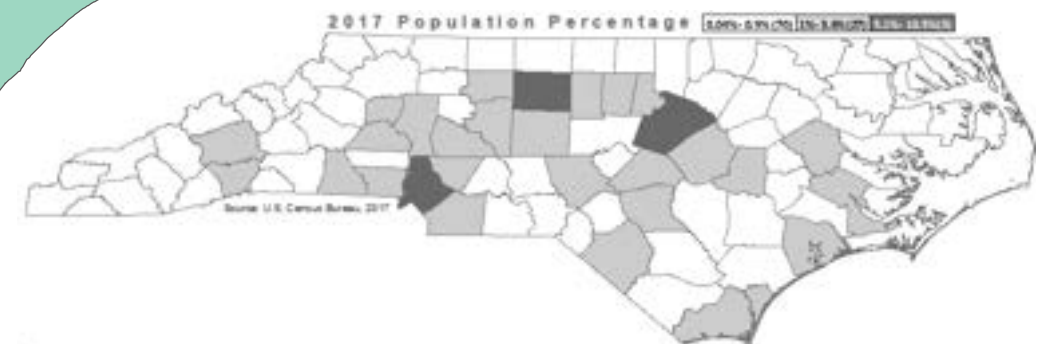

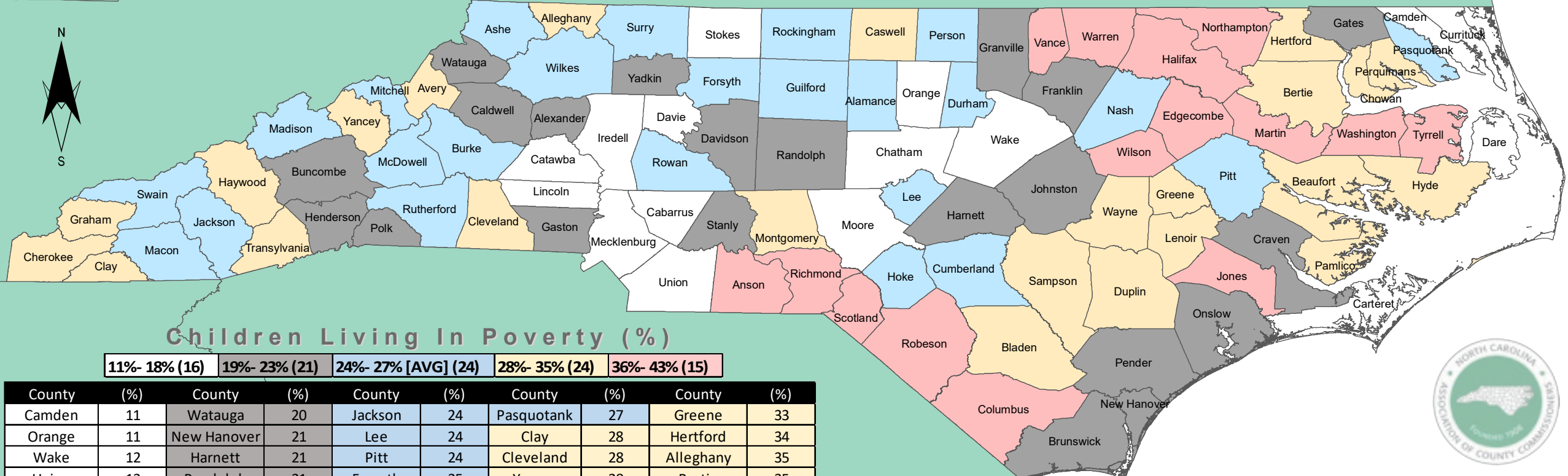

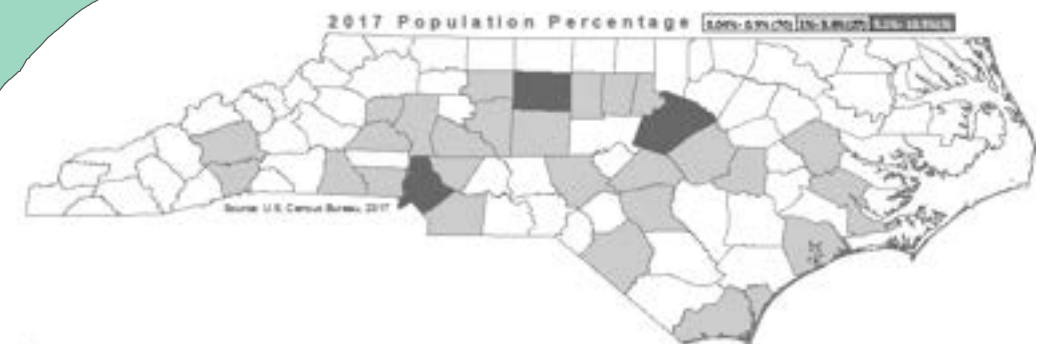
PERCENT OF CHILDREN LIVING IN POVERTY (2018)

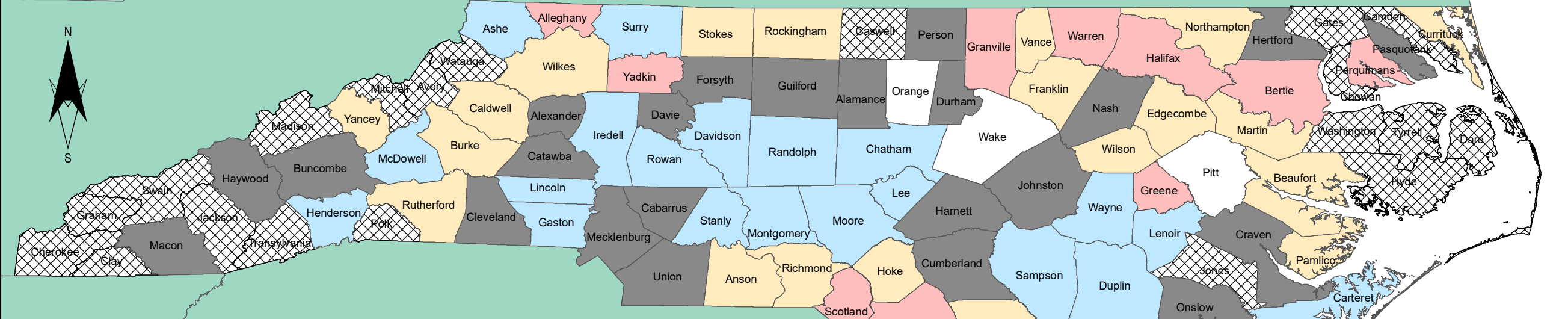

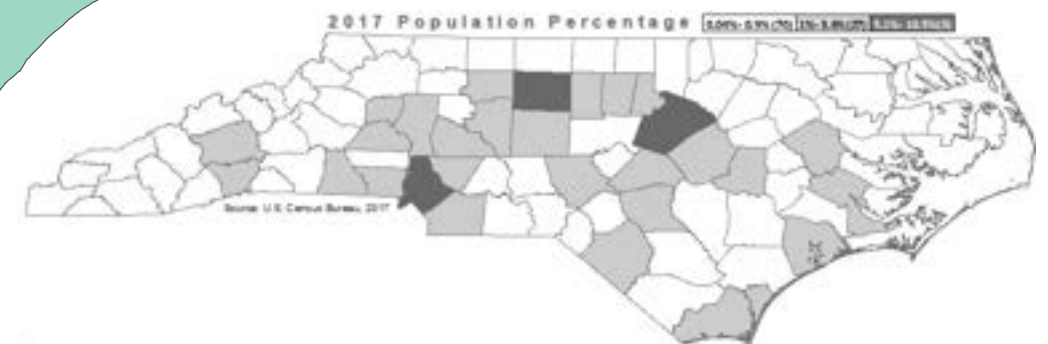

DISCONNECTED YOUTH (2018)



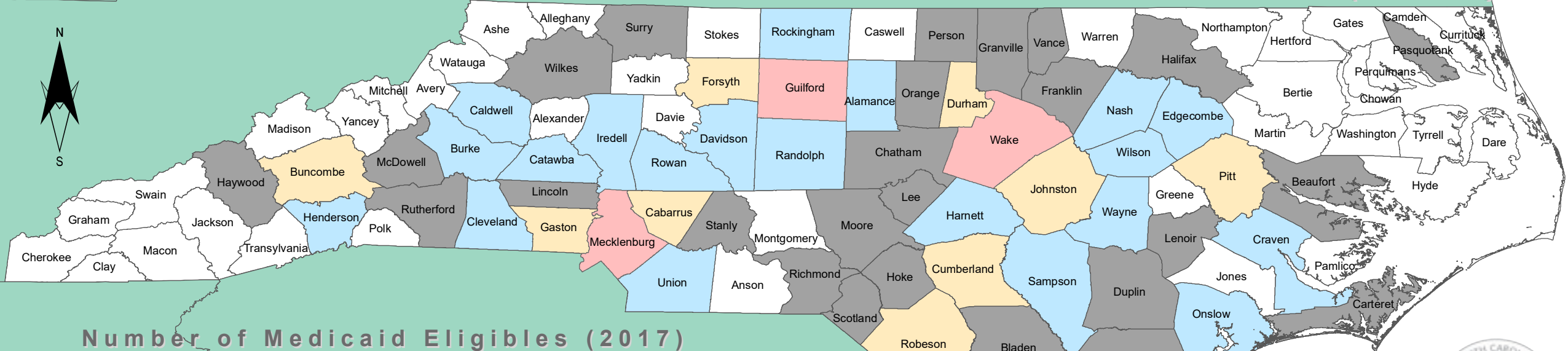

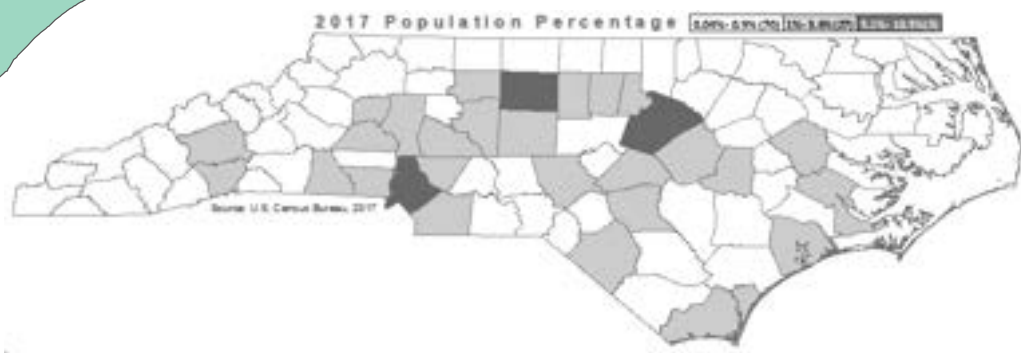

UNDUPLICATED COUNT OF MEDICAID ELIGIBLES (2017)



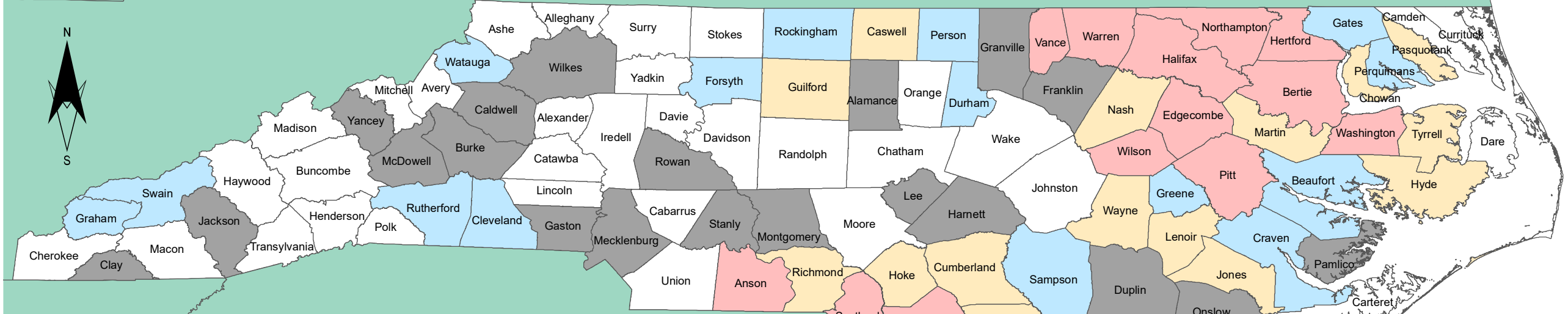

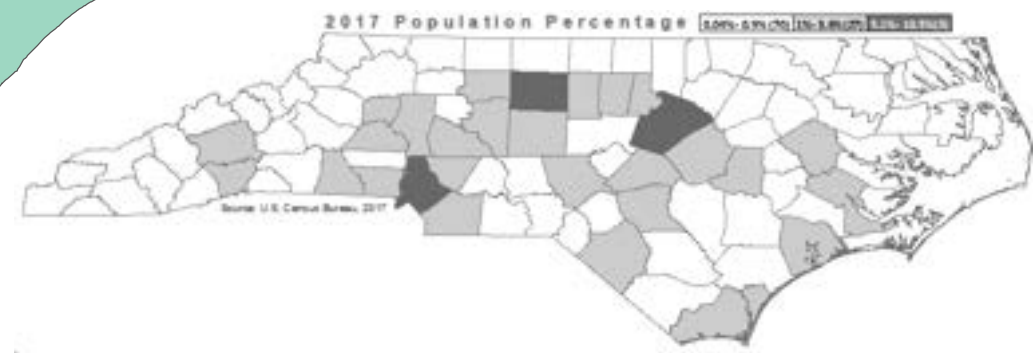
FOOD INSECURITY RATES PER COUNTY (2018)



Percent of County that is Food Insecure

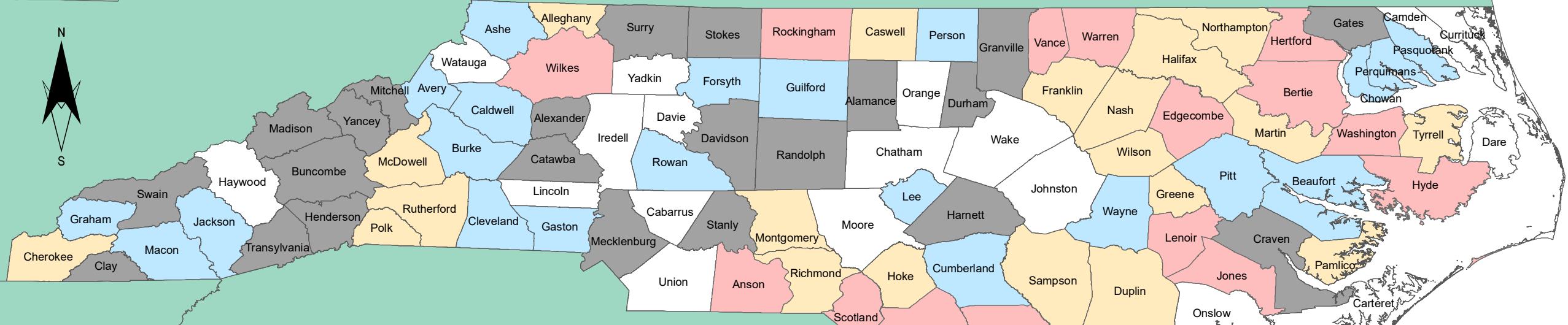

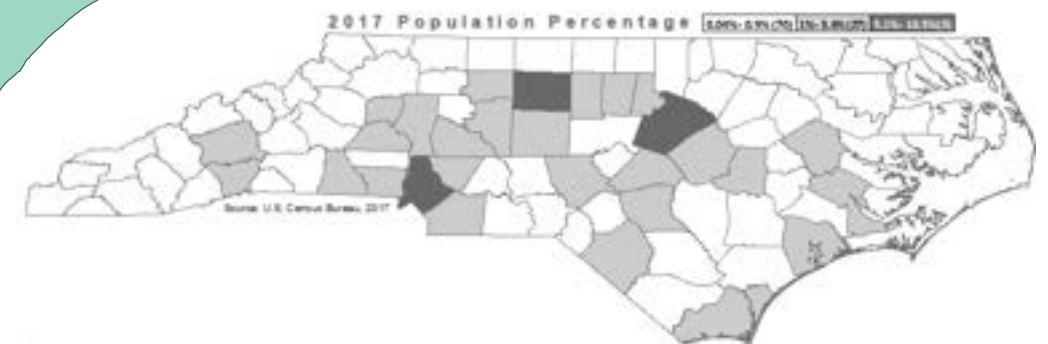
PERCENT OF STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR FREE OR REDUCED PRICE LUNCH (2018)



Percent of Students Eligible for Free or Reduced Lunch

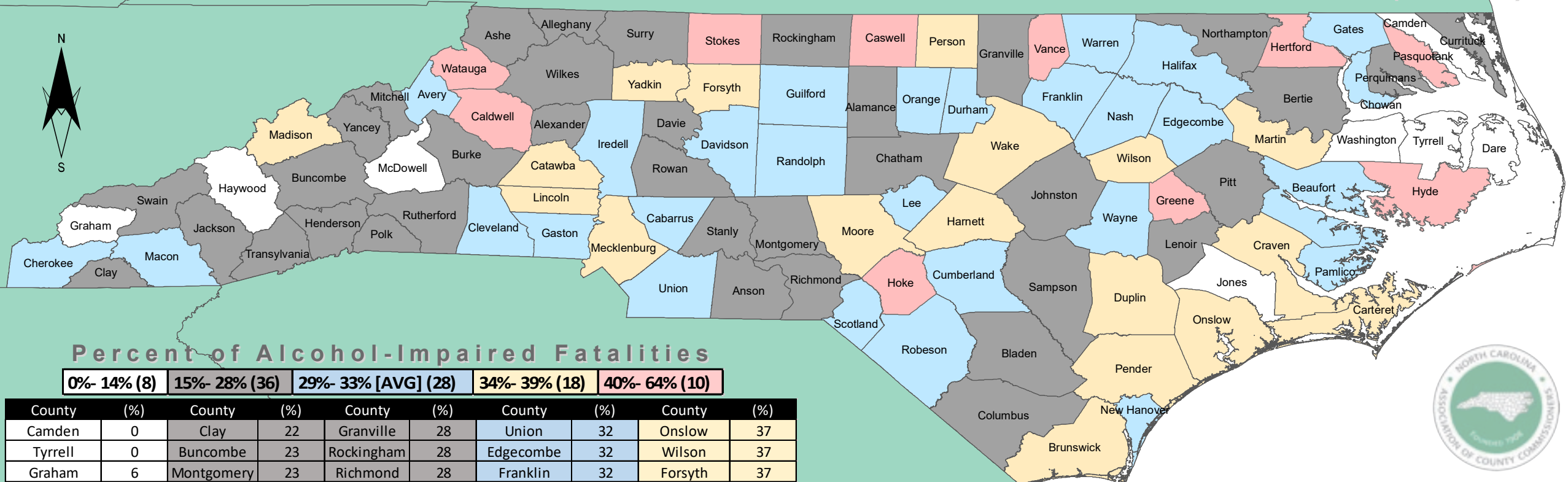

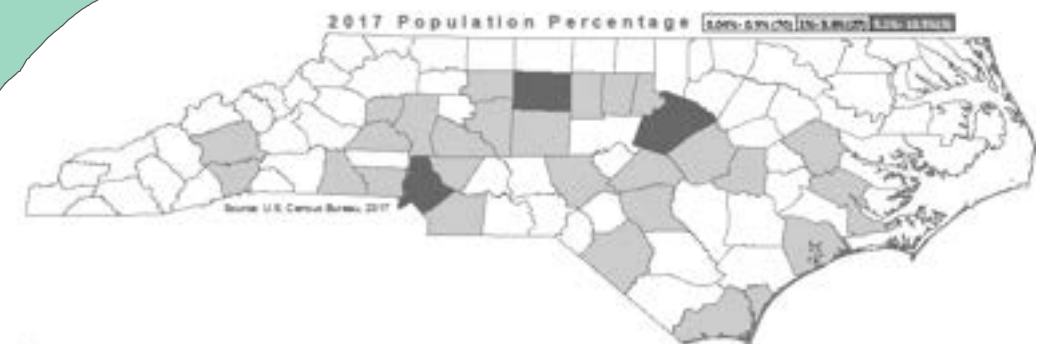
PERCENT OF ALCOHOL-IMPAIRED DRIVING FATALITIES (2018)



Percent of Alcohol-Impaired Fatalities

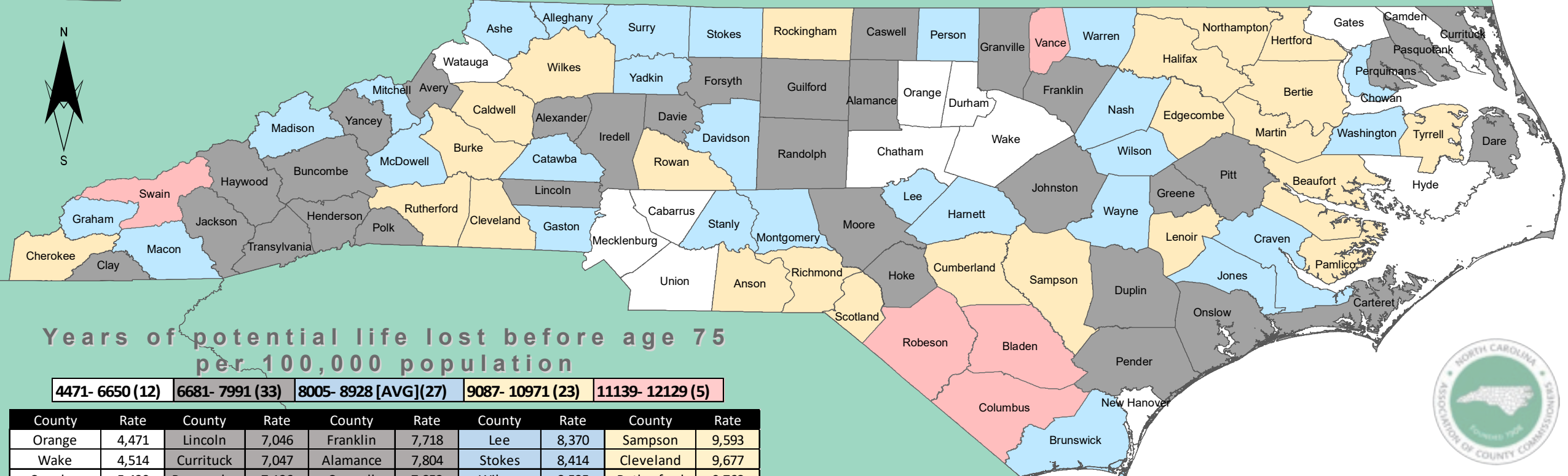

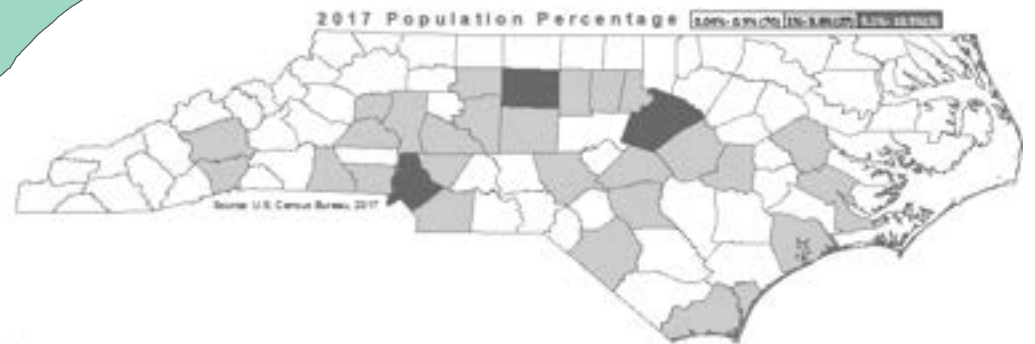
PREMATURE DEATH RATES (2018)



Years of potential life lost before age 75 per 100,000 population

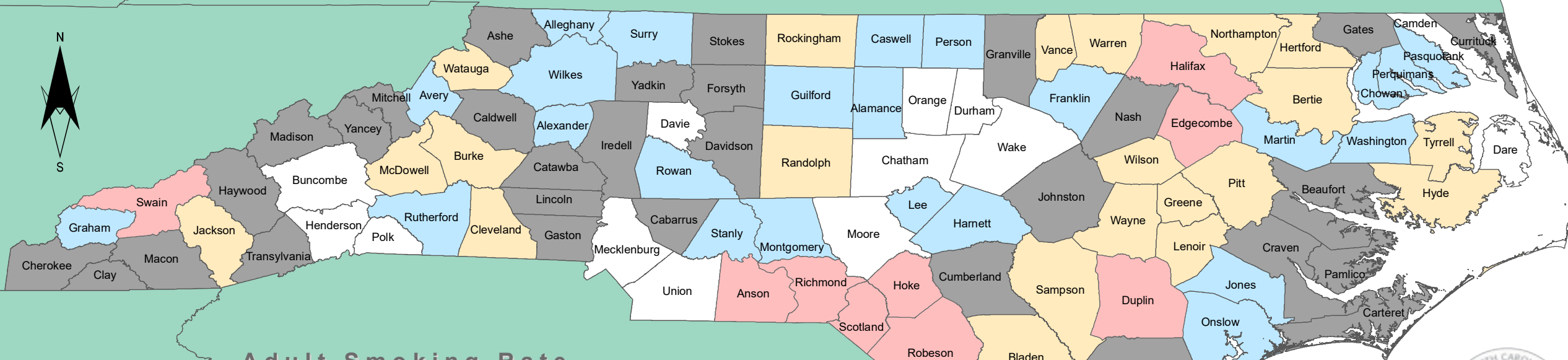

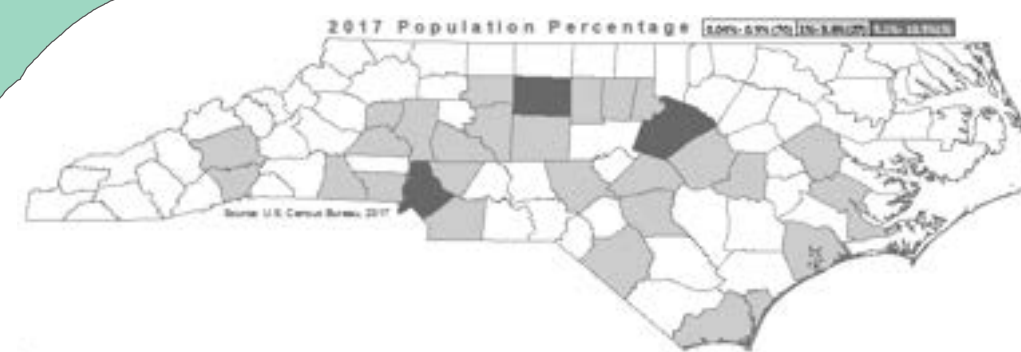
TOBACCO SMOKING RATES PER COUNTY (2018)



Adult Smoking Rate

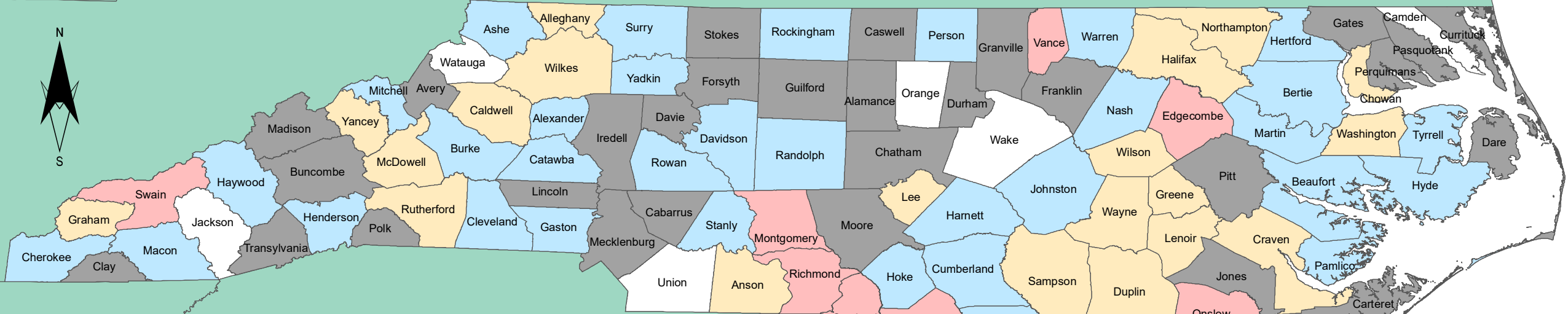

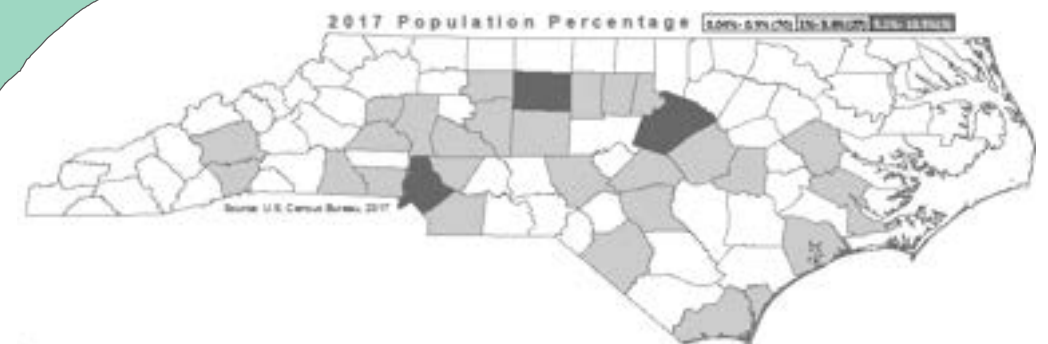
TEEN BIRTH RATES PER COUNTY (2018)



Number of births per 1,000, female population ages 15-19

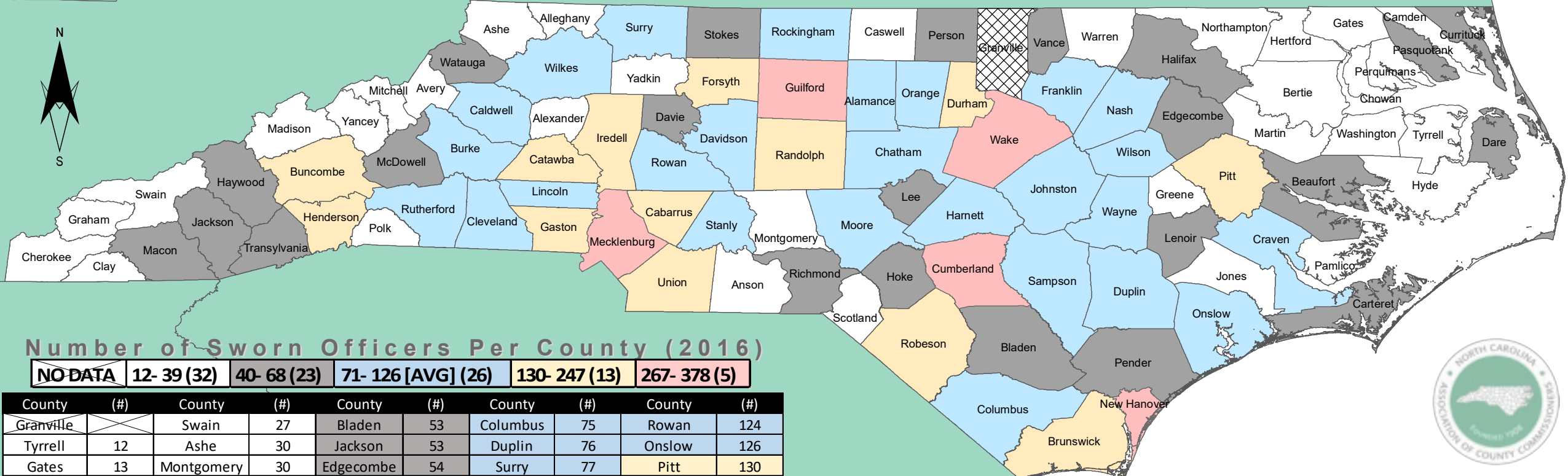

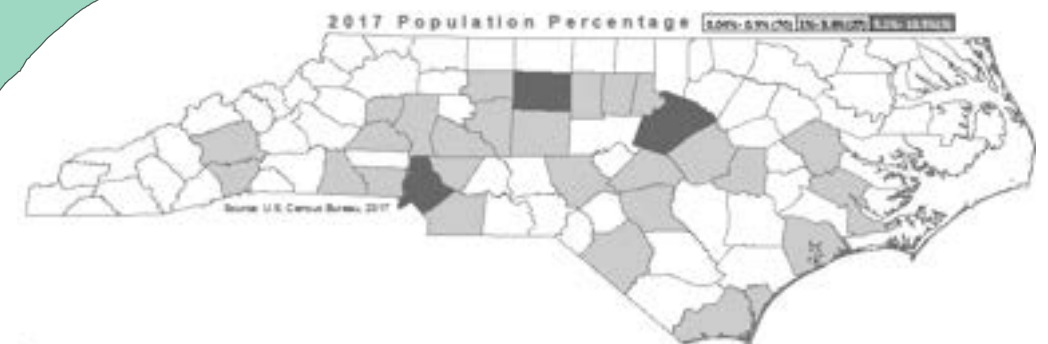
SWORN OFFICERS (2016)



Number of Sworn Officers Per County (2016)

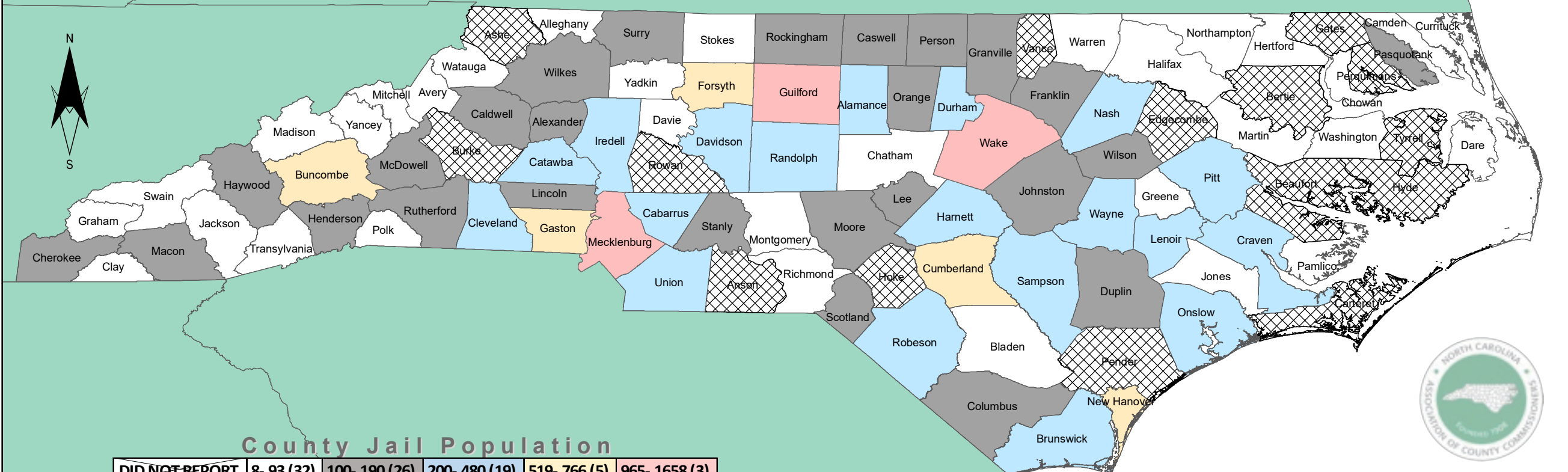

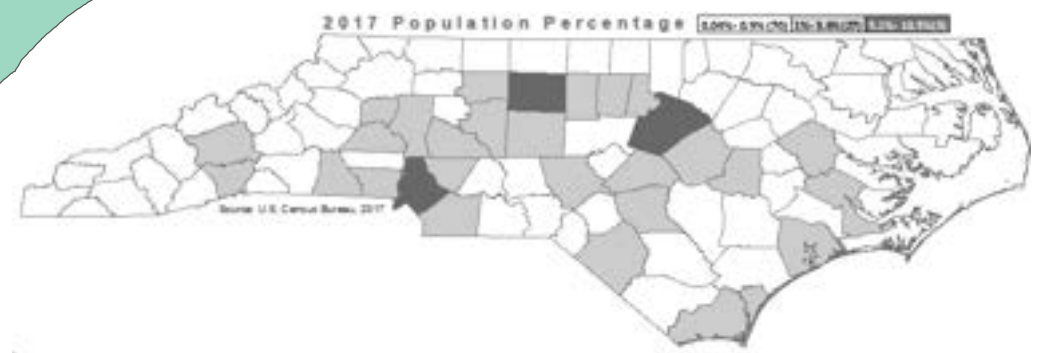
COUNTY JAIL AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION (2016-18)



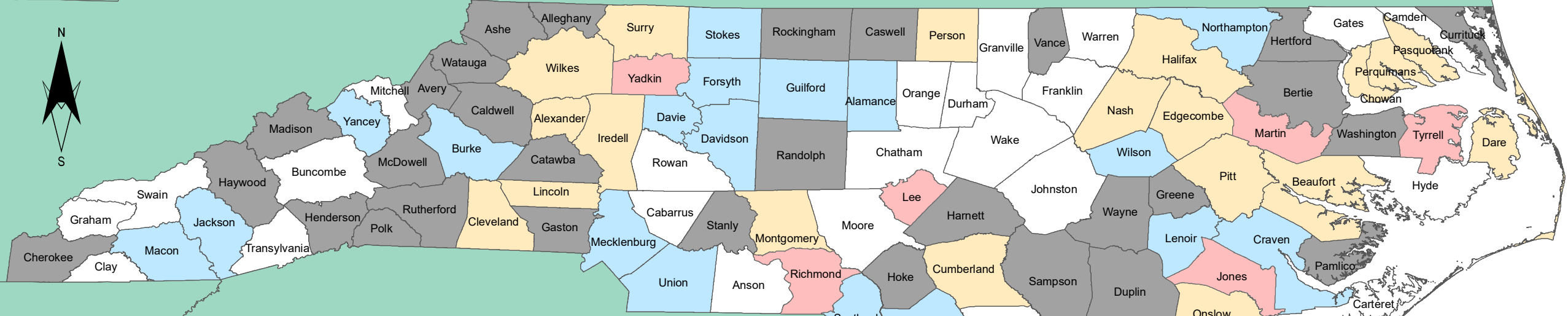

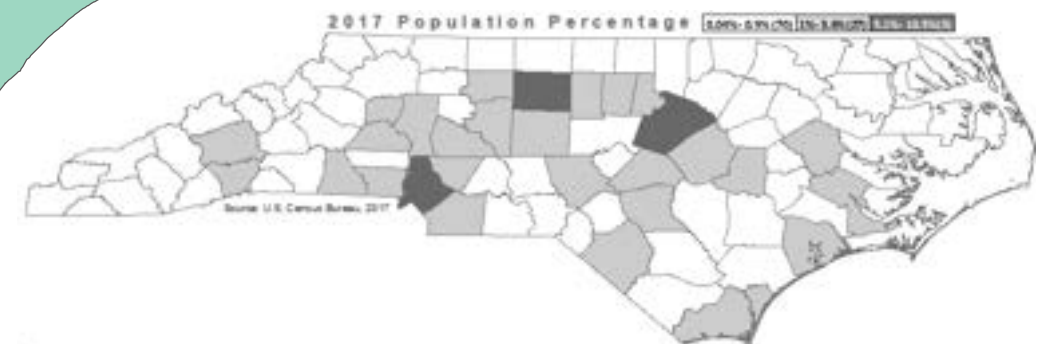
JUVENILE CRIME RATE (2017)



Juvenile Crime Rate per 1,000, Age 6 to 15

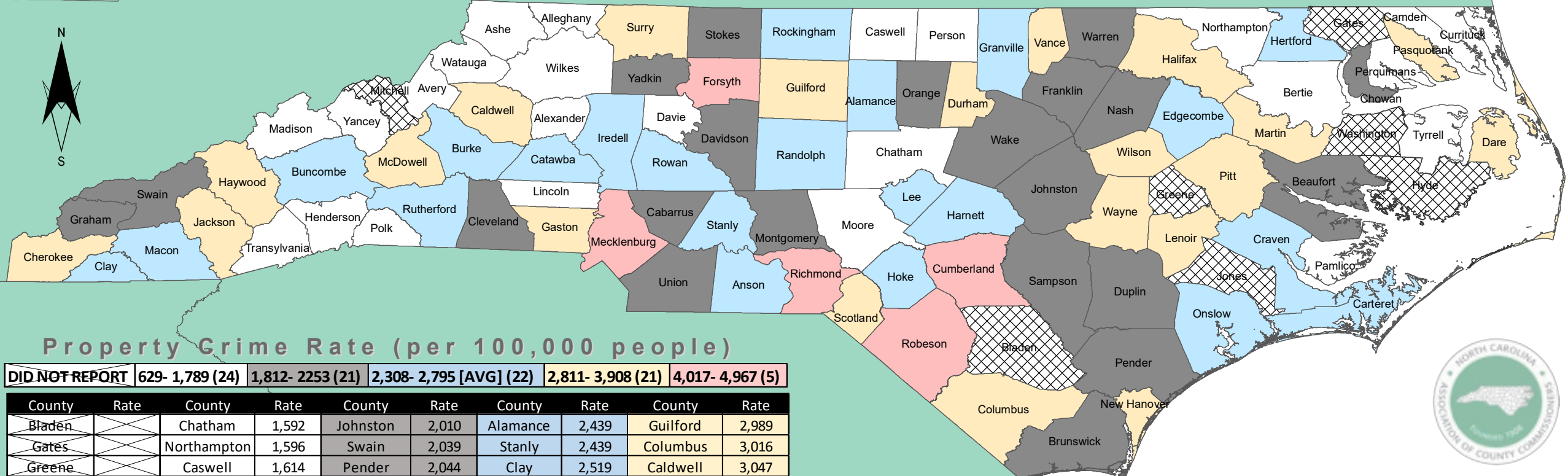

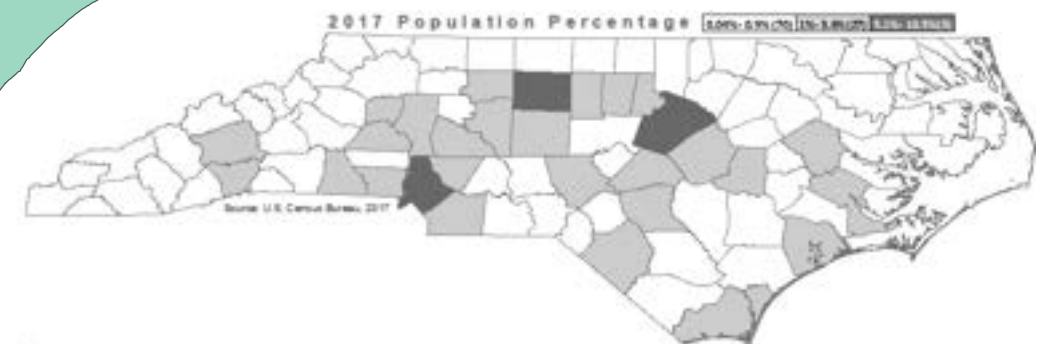
PROPERTY CRIME RATE (2016)

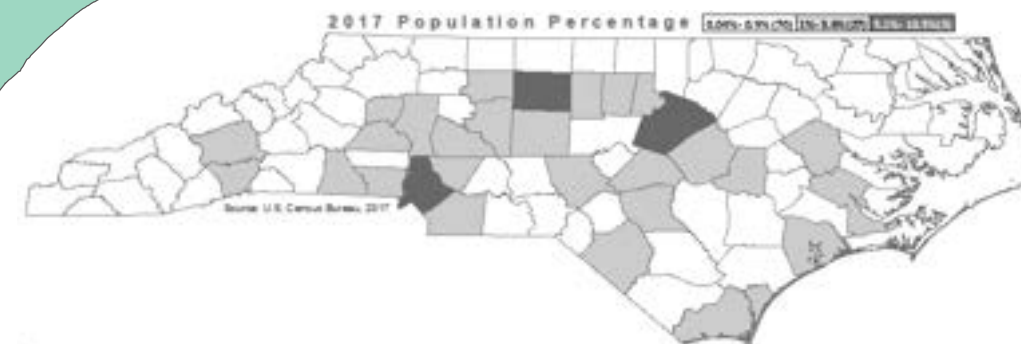

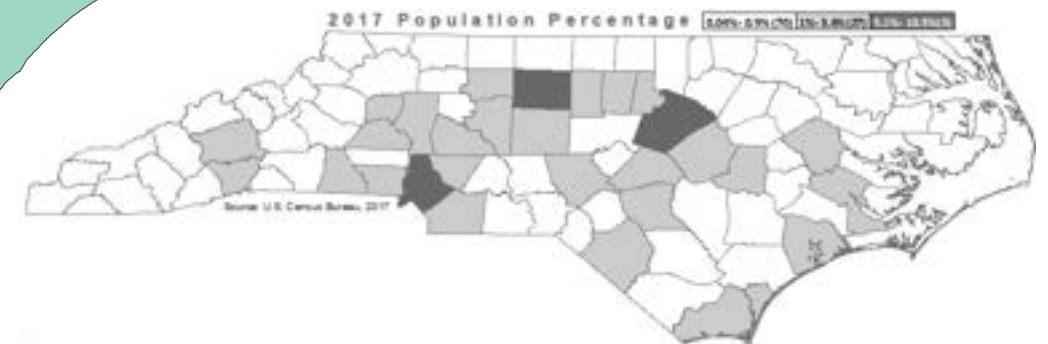

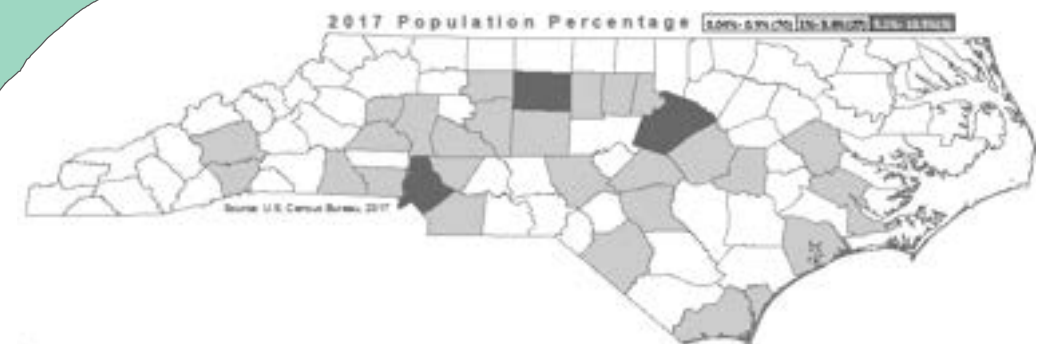
NUMBER OF COUNTY EMPLOYEES

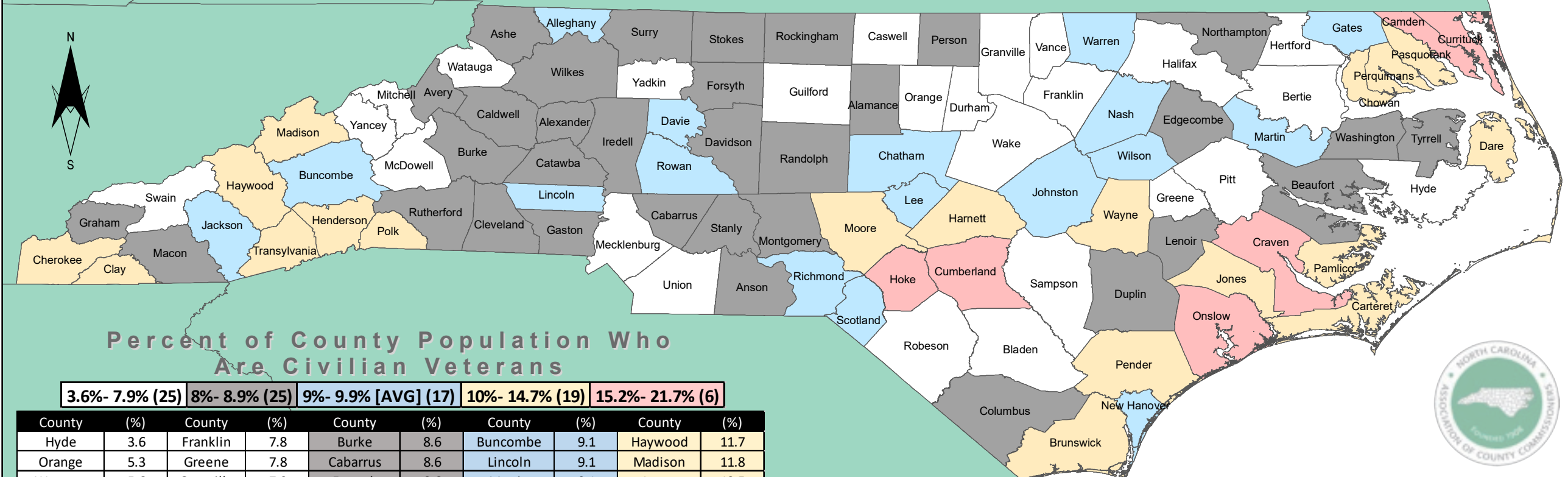

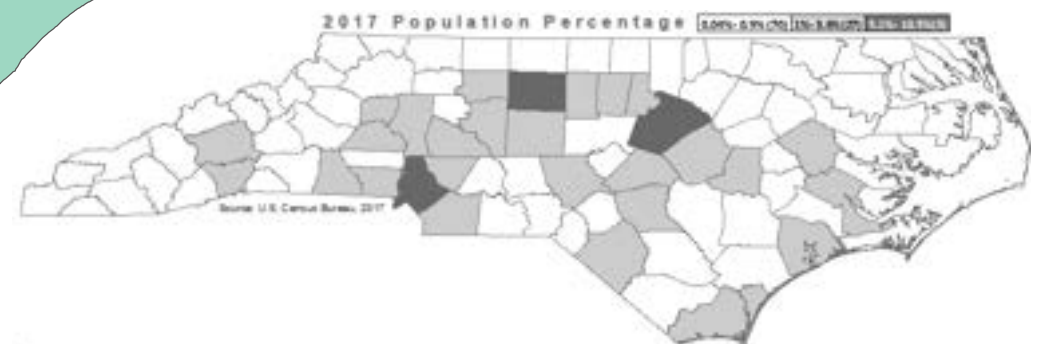
PERCENT OF COUNTY POPULATION WHO ARE CIVILIAN VETERANS
